A COMMENT

In several papers I have read lately there is comment on the fact that there are so many dogs and so few deer days at present and some feel that the buck law should be amended.

My husband hunts every year and his fondness for out-door life and recreation naturally brings him into contact with associates of nature, therefore I have a great deal of actual experience. Often I accompany him to their hunting, even though I never hunt and am afraid of a gun. Nevertheless I love the wild and I give me great pleasure to study the nature of these queer little creatures. I have seen more pleasure than to sit by the evening campfire and have my husband tell me of the day's experience at hunting. He has secured the limit for the past six years and has one to his credit for this season, so I feel I can state these facts from experience.

It is very true there are lots of deer and a number of hairy dogs. There are also a number of foxes but they are very shy and seldom seen. By sitting on some pinnacle and observing them from the evening, when you can often do in the summer time, you seldom see a deer without seeing a fox playing near and

if you will observe carefully where there are deer, you will always see the little track. Just note the number of two-point bucks that are killed. That means last year he was a fawn and his spike horns could not be observed only under close inspection, which opportunity is seldom afforded and there is no doubt but that the young bucks are as serviceable for breeding purposes as the older ones. It is not probable that every dog can raise a fawn every year, as is true with cattle. If you can kill your cows and this is impossible with deer, you may have an opportunity to study them through the summer but usually they are on the alert for every sound and if you shoot it must be as soon as you sight your deer and about all a person can do is look for the horns.

Twelve or even ten years ago the hunter can remember the security of deer. There were as many buck as doe—but were there as many deer. A doe that has raised her young is poor and would not make good meat. The barren doe is fat and no doubt would make the best meat, but it is very seldom that you could choose your deer thus.

In our estimation, many accidents are averted by the fact that the hunter must look for horns, for well we know that the conscientious person is not very likely to shoot a person if he is looking for deer with horns.

Isn't it a fact that in nearly every locality today there are more deer killed than in years past, unless it was in the days of the real pioneer. Even when we were permitted to kill both sex, isn't there as many deer brought to your locality as in the past, since the deer laws?

Therefore we feel it would be a grave mistake to permit the killing of deer. Keep the buck law and if necessary permit the killing of only one buck, but don't permit the killing of doe at least for a number of years.

It makes it easier for your game warden, it averts accidents and your deer are increasing in number. Just notice the number of two-point bucks killed and you will know that this article contains actual facts.
