PARIS (AP)—The French Automobile Salon does not admit exhibits from former enemy states. Two years ago when a German firm whose name had been connected with the planes that dropped bombs on London and Paris during the war succeeded in introducing their models under cover of a Dutch house, so great an outcry was raised that the exhibit was withdrawn.

A Vienna firm this year succeeded in using the Salon even if it was unable to show inside the Grand Palais. It rented a summer restaurant in the Champs Elysees, which had closed at the end of the season, and showed its models, which were viewed by many on their way to or from the Salon nearby.

Warning Auto Owners

The United States public health service sends out a timely warning to owners of automobiles against the increased danger in cold weather of death from carbon monoxide poisoning. It refers to a recent news item telling of the death of a prominent Baltimore man found in his garage with the engine of his automobile still running. With the advent of cold weather such accidents will probably increase in frequency.

Tests have been made by the public health service showing that a small 23-horsepower engine in "warming up" will give off enough poisonous gas to contaminate the air of a small closed garage 10x20 feet to the danger point in about three minutes. Carbon monoxide is colorless, tasteless and almost odorless. Its effect is paralysis of the respiratory apparatus, and its attack is so insidious that even though the victim may become aware of his danger he is often unable to escape because of loss of motive power.

The bulletin therefore warns every person who runs an engine in a small garage to see to it that the room is properly ventilated. Windows and doors should be opened if the motor is permitted to run for even a few minutes.

What of the Future?

The picture of an age in which only the mentally strong will survive is no flight of the imagination.
