WITH THE AMERICAN LEGION
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CHIEFS SEEK LOWER RATES

PARIS, (AP)—The organizers of international fairs met recently under the auspices of the International Chamber of Commerce, Czechoslovakia, France, Great Britain, Italy, Luxembourg and the Netherlands being represented. Resolutions were adopted for the approval of the International Chamber of Commerce respecting facilities for fairs, as follows:

That there should be a reduction of 50 percent on transport charges, going and coming, to the benefit of the exhibitors and merchandise; that the reduction be granted on all lines, irrespective of the countries through which they may be passing.

Reduction of 50 percent on transport charges to the benefit of the buyers; this reduction to be granted on the railway lines of the country in which the fair is held; also the validity of return tickets should be extended on these lines to the benefit of the buyers.

The amendment of reduction of taxes relating to visas of passports. The extension of the system of temporary admission in countries which have not yet adopted it, and the simplification of formalities of clearance through the Customs.

That propaganda documents of international fairs be admitted free of duty.

Hunting for Treasure Popular Near Border

TACOMA, Wash. (AP)—The days of treasure seekers after pirate caches may be gone for good, but they are just beginning for the residents along the ocean beaches of this state. More than one vessel, laden with liquor from British Columbia and bound for ports in Washington, Oregon and California has piled up on one of the beaches as the result of gales or poor navigation or both.

Such a vessel was pounded to pieces by the surf, and the liquor on board landed in the sea or scattered among the driftwood along the shore to await the discovery of treasure seekers.

The last run-ship to suffer such a fate was the halibut boat Alfa, loaded with 212 cases of whiskey and rum. It is believed that the Alfa was headed for Willapa Harbor, north of the Columbia river. A storm buffeted the craft and evidently opened up her seams. To save themselves the crew headed for the beach at high tide. They escaped, leaving the Alfa at the mercy of waves and wind. Before custom officers arrived much of the liquor had been removed, and the rest of the cargo could not be salvaged because the waves had dug a "grave" for the vessel. But the sea gradually will work the wreck into the beach and put the liquor within reach of industrious and thirsty treasure hunters.

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BONANZA TOWN OF 1906-08 NOW BUT A TOWN OF RUINS

GOLDFIELD, Nev. (AP)—Two days within a year have left little but blackened and crumbling ruins in this one-time bonanza town of the West.

From 1906 to 1908 the town had 20,000 people. The lure of gold had brought them from everywhere. Some of the lots on which charred skeletons of structures stand were bought and sold in a frenzy of speculation, for from \$25,000 to \$50,000. Miners took \$200,000,000 in gold from the region about the city.

Today nothing is left of Goldfield's former glory but the five-story Goldfield Hotel, which by some miracle escaped both fires. For the moment it represents practically the entire business of the town. The postoffice has temporary quarters at one end, the bank at another. Even much of ground floor space is occupied by interest vital to the community.

The old-timers still hope that more gold may be found and that their town will stage a "come-back."

Vocational Educators To Meet in Indiana

INDIANAPOLIS, (AP)—Inspection tours in several Indiana cities are included in the program before arranged for the eighteenth annual convention of the National Society for Vocational Education, which will be held here Dec. 11-13. Every state is expected to be represented by state and city directors of vocational education, university instructors interested in vocational training and manufacturers who are cooperating in the vocational program. An exhibit by manufacturers who employ vocational students will be a feature.

Delegates who meet in Chicago will visit plants between that city and Indianapolis on the way to the convention. Those who come from the east will visit plants in northeastern and eastern Indiana, and those from the south will visit plants in the southern part of the state, coming onto Hoosier soil from Louisville and Cincinnati.
