EDUCATION NEEDS ARE SOUGHT BY COLLEGE SURVEY

EVANSTON, Ill. (AP)—A survey-
ing, educational inventory of the
Northwestern University will be
made by prominent educators of
other universities. President Wal-
ter Dill Scott has announced.
Every department and school in
the college will be inventoried. The
first attempt of its kind made by
a major institution, he said.

"The public is aware that the
number attending institutions of
higher learning has increased, and
that the cost of education has in-
creased at an even faster rate," said
President Scott. "These changes
are, however, among the least sig-
nificant of those that are occur-
ring. We are altering our view
as to the ideal and aims of edu-
cation, and we are modifying our
methods as the approved practices
of attaining the desired aims."

"Educational administration is
attempting not only to adopt ap-
proved methods, but to improve the
future in an attempt to make the
educational institution perform the
greatest service to the student to
the community and to the advance-
ment of civilization. We have under-
taken a survey that in thoroughness
and in breadth of view will con-
tribute favorably with any survey
made by any industrial, commer-
cial or educational institution."
