### COAST LEAGUE SESSIONS END

SEATTLE, Wash. (By the Associated Press)—The annual meeting of the Pacific Coast Baseball League closed here Tuesday after adopting resolutions regarding Walter Johnson, pitcher of the American League club, that he could buy the Oakland franchise and create that no other club would encroach on his territory, maintaining the first 100 weeks of the year in Salt Lake City, and inviting the National Association of Minor Leagues of America to hold its 125th convention on the Pacific coast probably at Los Angeles.
