LONDON (AP)—Officials of the Ministry of Health declare that they have set up a silent barrage against plague, typhus fever and cholera which costs the country only \$500,000 yearly. "Probably the cheapest insurance premium in the world."

An official stated that the whole of the coastline of Great Britain and the shores of navigable rivers are included in a sanitary district, the council of which is responsible for dealing with any sea-borne infections diseases that may be introduced into the district.
