New Principle in Motors Being Tested on West Coast.

YACOMA, Wash., (AP)—A new principle in gasoline motors is being tested here on a power boat. The tests are being watched by engineers and others to discover if a new era in the history of an engine is to be marked.

The engine under experiment is the invention of three Spokane, Wash., men. It operates on a gas-paraffin-in-piston plan that does away with the need of any valve gear and is declared to produce a quiet-running motor of great efficiency.

The motor is intended for use in automobiles, but first tests are being made here. The specimen under investigation was built on specifications laid down by a group of consulting engineers, after preliminary tests had been made at the University of Michigan last year.

### Expenses of Operating Movie Theatres in Paris Rise 12 Fold

PARIS (AP)—Cinematograph show proprietors are loud in their complaints against the high cost of carrying on their trade. Their principal expense, the hiring of a program of films, has increased thirtyfold since 1913.

In that year the principal expenses for a small establishment were 100 francs for hire of films a week, experienced operator, 120 francs a month, a good first violin, 250 francs a month, taxes, 250 francs. At the present time, however, the same entertainment costs 1,000 to 2,000 francs for hire of films a week, 200 francs a month, first violin, 1,200 francs taxes, 4,700 francs.

## ICE IN ARCTIC SETS RECORD

SEATTLE (AP)—How the ice in the Arctic Ocean, the worst this year that white men have ever known in the waters north of Alaska, worked to destroy two gasoline schooners, the Arctic of Man franchise and the Lady Kindersley of Vancouver, B. C., was related by Captain John Backlund, master of the sailing schooner, C. S. Holmes, which is wintering here.

"I have been going into the Arctic since 1907," said Captain Backlund, "but never before did I find the ice so extensive as this year. The bergs were not so large as I have seen them, but the pack was tremendously more extensive."

The cause of the great fields of ice along the northern Alaska coast this summer was the prevailing westerly winds. There is the same quantity of ice in the Arctic each year, but the winds determine where the fields will form. With westerly or northwesterly winds, it will be found off the coast of Siberia.

Captain Backlund said the Lady Kindersley and the Arctic were lost by following leads through the ice, which closed upon them. Members of the crew of the Arctic made their way ashore to Point Barrow, Alaska, over the frozen ocean. The men of the Lady Kindersley were taken aboard the steamer Hoyer, of the United States bureau of education, after a hard passage with canoes and skin boats over and through three miles of ice. The crew of the Arctic and the Lady Kindersley were abandoned.
