Hints for the Housewife

OLD FASHIONED BAKED BEANS
Baked beans prepared with bacon, make a very desirable one-dish dinner. It is especially nice for busy days when one doesn't want to spend too much time in the preparation of a meal. But, an every housewife who has tried has discovered, making good baked beans is something of an art.

Pick over and wash two cupsful of dried white or kidney beans the evening before, and put them to soak in cold water, enough to cover. In the morning boil the beans, adding one tablespoonful of salt. When the skins loosen and turn black, remove from the fire and drain.

Have ready one half pound of sliced bacon, one medium sized onion, one and one half cupfuls tomatoes and two tablespoonfuls of molasses.

A deep enameled wire baking dish is most desirable for preparing beans, because it is proof against rust, vegetables and will not affect or be affected by the tomatoes. Also, being dainty and china-like in appearance it can be used as a serving dish.

Cover the bottom of a baking dish with some slices of bacon, add half the beans, salt, pepper and half the onion and tomatoes. Add the second layer in the same order. Pour over the molasses and boiling water to cover. Bake for three hours in a moderate oven.

Swiss Waiters and Cooks
Becoming necessary in Europe. LONDON (AP).—Swiss hotel waiters, called upon to deal each year with an increasing number of English-speaking tourists, will in the future have an opportunity for a thorough training under famous English masters of the profession, while English waiters may have a similar training in Switzerland, under an exchange agreement just made public by the ministry of labor.

Two hundred Swiss waiters will be sent to certain approved London and English resort hotels with the definite idea of learning the English language and methods, and a similar number of English waiters will be sent to Switzerland. It is possible that all classes of hotel servants, including cooks and chambermaids will be included in this year's quota.

PALO ALTO, Cal. (AP).—Fish can be trailed in their wanderings around the oceans in a manner not unlike police methods of tracking automobiles by their license numbers, according to Charles H. Gilbert, professor of zoology at Stanford University.
