### CHICAGO U AT TOP OF HEAP

CHICAGO, Ill. (By the Associated Press)—Chicago rose to the top of the heap in Saturday's Western conference football championship struggle and Notre Dame slipped towards her claim for national honors. The 2-0 loss of upsets the defeat of the previously unconquered University of Illinois eleven was outstanding in mid-Western collegiate football. Minnesota scored in the game earlier in the season and requested the Illinois coach to drop in one and admitted a severe blow in seriously injuring Harold "Red" Grange, the season's sensational back.

#### HUSKIES LEAD COAST SCORING

SEATTLE, Wash. (By the Associated Press)—University of Washington's 26-to-0 victory Saturday over a non-conference team, the College of Paper Chemical, formed the Huskies nearly 100 points ahead of the University of Montana, second high scorer among both Pacific collegiate football conference eleven. The Purdue and Gold team has piled up 341 points against 24 scored by opponents. Montana has earned 249 points by 174 by her opponents. Stanford scoring 44 of those. University of Southern California's 51-to-0 victory over Whittier Saturday placed the team third in standings over Stanford with 226 points to 27 earned by opponents. #### IDAHO LEADING OTHERS IN 'BABB' CONFERENCE RACE

SEATTLE, Wash. — Only two Pacific Northwest intercollegiate football games were played Saturday and the last week of the gridiron season opened with the position unchanged of all eleven in the race for championship honors. Gonzaga university scored an easy 63 to 0 victory over Whittier while Oregon and Washington State played each other to a standstill, the score being a tie, 7 to 7. Washington played a non-conference team, College of Puget Sound and won, 26 to 0. On Saturday the conference teams scheduled to be seen in action are Washington and Washington State, Whittier and Montana, Pacific and Willamette, and the University of Oregon and the Oregon Aggies. The standings of the two first leaders, Idaho and Gonzaga, will be unchanged as they are not scheduled to play again against each other this year, although Idaho may arrange a conference game early in December. 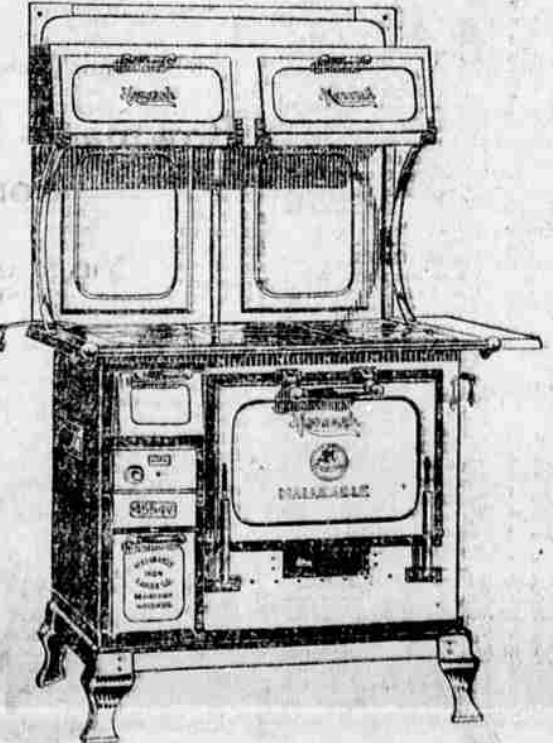
