Mexican Farmers Badly
In Need of Ready Money

MEXICO CITY (AP)—Discussion
of a project for the establishment
of agricultural and industrial banks
to finance manufacturers and agri-
cultural products which the govern-
ment is restoring to the peasants under
the existing agrarian laws, has been
initiated by the permanent com-
mission of the Bankers Convention,
called to outline a new banking
system for submission to congress.
Mexico's agricultural future in
monoculture and crop totals already
have been greatly reduced, it was

pointed out during the discussions,
because many villages and individ-
uals who have been awarded lands
have been unable to work them as
a result of inability to buy machin-
ery and finance themselves until
their first crops are sold. Thus
great districts, once productive, are
now neglected and abandoned, not-
ably in the state of Morelos, once
one of the richest states in the re-
public.

FIVE EASTERN TEAMS IN RACE

NEW YORK (By the Associated
Press)—With the end of the 1924
Eastern football season only two
weeks off, the contest for premier
sectional honors remains an
"open race." When a year ago
the battle had narrowed down to
two outstanding eleven, Yale and
Cornell, the stretch this year finds
five teams putting forward little
claims.

Saturday's results, adding fur-
ther fuel to the blaze of upsets
that has marked the season's path
so far, produced outstanding fea-
tures in the decisive victory of
Yale over Princeton, blasting the
"Tigers" hopes of a "Big Three"
championship while strengthening
the Blue's chances, and the score-
less tie between Pennsylvania and
Drexel State which helped the
Quakers from their lofty perch
as the only eleven neither
beaten nor tied.

Pennsylvania's record of eight
victories, one tie and no defeats,
still keeps her to the front in the
title scramble, but the Red and
Blue now must share the heights
with Dartmouth and Rutgers, each
of which also has only one tie to
show its record. The big Green out-
fit, held to even terms only by
Yale, closed its season with
smashing 27 to 14 triumph over
Cornell at the Polo grounds, and
with other victories over Harvard
and Brown to its credit must be
considered when final honors are
distributed.

Rutgers, tied only by Lehigh,
added another impressive victory
to her list by trouncing New
York University, while Yale and
Lehigh complete the list of promi-
nent unbeaten aggregations.

**International Labor Body
Considers Taking in Russia**

GENEVA (AP)—A distinct step
toward preparing for the eventual
admission of Russia to the Inter-
national Labor office was taken re-
cently by the governing body of
that organization. A resolution
was adopted declaring that in view
of the importance of preparing
for official relations with Russia,
and of the necessity of informing
Russian labor groups of just what
the international labor organiza-
tion is accomplishing, full power
is given to Albert Thomas, the di-
rector, to take any initiative he
may deem desirable in connection
with Russia.

Director Thomas informed the
board that 40 new ratifications of
international labor conventions
had come in since the last meet-
ing and that the Italian govern-
ment had given conditional ratifica-
tion to the Washington eight-hour
convention. This brings the total
of ratifications of international con-
ventions up to 155.
