The names are the same—but they're no relation, except that both were officers in the British army and served together in India. Malcolm was an officer in the British army for years, and finally left it to become an engineer, and then he became the movies.

Reginald Denny served in the Royal Air Force, went to India, then returned to the stage and hence to the movies.

HIGHWAY TAX IS VOTED
MOLLAHA, Ore.—A tax of 1.5 mills was voted for grading a three-mile stretch of the Oregon City-Mollaha highway and a special road district was created at a special election held at Liberal. The improvement project was carried 3 to 1.

It is proposed to prepare a standard grade for paving to connections at Tamas and Mollaha. Estimated cost of the project is about \$19,000.

Five districts, including all those from Oregon City to Willard Springs are included in the special district, which has an assessed valuation of \$7,000,000.
