Movie Fans Show Preference For Lloyd Hamilton.

Lloyd Hamilton, the star of "The Barker Kid," the new feature brought back comedy which was the Sherry theater for a two day run, is one of the most popular comedians on the screen. A questionnaire sent to several thousand exhibitors and motion picture editors of the country asking what screen comedian is appearing in the most popular with patrons of the theaters, proved that Charles Chaplin, Harold Lloyd and Lloyd Hamilton were the best liked. This is most significant in view of the fact that Hamilton has never made a feature length comedy before.

James W. Dean, well known motion picture critic, whose syndicated reviews appear in hundreds of newspapers, said of Lloyd Hamilton:

"I dare say Hamilton is inherently a funnier man than Chaplin or Lloyd or Keaton. He is the only one of the four who makes me laugh when I meet him. Chaplin's shuffle is no funnier than Hamilton's toe-hold-hip-shoulder-mat. Keaton's frozen face is no more grotesque than the expressive map of Hamilton. Lloyd has the appearance of an unapproachable youth, but Hamilton's countenance is often as innocent as a baby's."

In "The Barker Kid" Hamilton has the part of Claude Sappington, an amateur sleuth, who in his effort to capture a murderer, applies burnt cork, mixes with the "red hot" gangsters, and has many wild adventures as a result. The supporting cast in this screaming comedy of two colors includes Tom Wilson, Tom O'Malley, Lucille La Verne, Irma Harrison, Edna May Speer, Sally Long, Kate Bruce and Warren Cook.

Communists Run Bureau To Issue False Passports

BERLIN, (AP) - Berlin police, raiding recently the rooms of two Communists in a suburb, discovered a passport forging plant conducted with great efficiency and evidently run, not to make money, but to facilitate the movement of German Communist workers.

The outfit of the two young men conducting this enterprise, who posed as architects, to avert suspicion, was most complete. It consisted of checks to credit various banks, blank passports of various countries, cameras, and detailed records of the persons to whom false passports had been issued, or from whom legitimate passports had been obtained.

It was evident that the operations of the forgers had not extended beyond countries bordering on Germany.

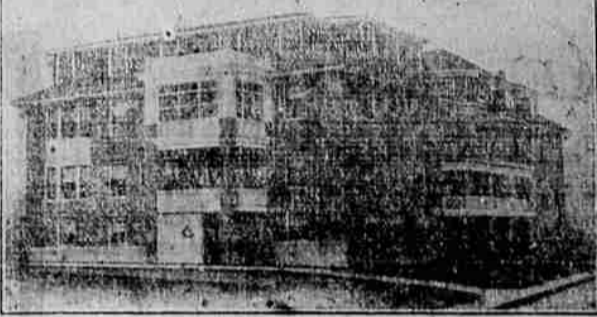
