## PENN LEADING EASTERN TEAM

### Final Game with Penn State Thursday; Hanover Second; Yale Is Third.

NEW YORK (AP)—Pennsylvania's football team, led by Penn State but undefeated, has one more hedge to cross. Pennsylvania will entertain Cornell on Thursday. Victory for the Quakers will not, however, prevent them from being named the strongest team in the east but will permit them to lead the list in games won and lost, due to a longer schedule than that attempted by Dartmouth.

The Hanover eleven, with seven games won and one tied, played its last contest a week ago against Cornell, leaving Penn to hold the array this week with eight won and one tied. Yale held Dartmouth to a deadlock and Yale stands third in the list with six won and two tied.

Penn State, which mirrored Pennsylvania's record, has lost two games this season. Yale, having defeated Princeton and Harvard, is next in line to claiming a national championship.

Backell, by defeating Rutgers, finished the schedule a notch higher than the Jerseymen, for while such team won seven and lost only one, Rutgers was held to a 15 to 13 score by Lehigh.

Lafayette, twice conquered, dragged Lehigh down to the middle of the list last Sunday.

Harvard New London.

Near the bottom of the list of 21 leading colleges of the east are five institutions which have always been powerful contenders in gridiron warfare, are Cornell, Pittsburg, Harvard, Brown and Navy.

Most surprising is the presence near the top of little Williams, which defeated Cornell and had no contest, that to Columbia.

Army and Navy, last of the football squad and with four standing leads for this year, will meet next Saturday at Baltimore, producing one of the most colorful spectacles known to the gridiron game and ending the eastern gridiron season.

On the holiday Cornell meets Pennsylvania, Brown and Colgate will meet at Providence, West Virginia at Washington and Jefferson at Morgantown, W. Va., Syracuse and Columbia at New York, and Pitt and Penn State at Pittsburgh. University of Oregon will journey to Milwaukee to face the national champion eleven, which was stopped this year by Princeton after three years of whitewash victories.

Behind the Army-Navy and Stanford-Notre Dame will meet at Philadelphia, Georgetown will oppose Fordham at New York and Boston college and Holy Cross will meet at Boston.

## HUSKIES BALK AT GAME WITH IDAHO

SEATTLE (AP)—University of Washington's football squad unanimously voted Monday against a proposal to play the University of Idaho eleven here December 6. Darwin Melrose, graduate manager, announced. The squad expressed a willingness to play Notre Dame, Stanford or some other team but that they did not desire to play Idaho for the players said they "had enough football this year" and did not desire to prolong the season, according to Melrose.

Melrose interpreted the team's decision as meaning that the squad was "unwilling to extend the season if an uninvited eleven would play." It was pointed out that the purple and gold didn't wish to play Idaho because the Vagabonds were defeated Saturday by the University of Southern California. Stanford and Notre Dame were mentioned as "undefeated eleven" by the Huskies. Melrose asserted.

## BROWNS, CARDS ONLY NON-FLAG BASEBALL TEAMS

NEW YORK (AP)—The two St. Louis clubs are in a class by themselves. They are the only clubs of the two major leagues that have not won a pennant in what is generally termed modern baseball. That record is counted from 1906, when the American league entered into competition with the National.

Notwithstanding the consistent failure of the Cardinals and Browns to finish in front they have won a wide distribution of pennants in the two circles. In fact during the last 15 years every one of the other 14 teams in both leagues has won at least one championship.

The general distribution of pennants in which the Browns and Cardinals have been passed by may be dated from 1909. In that year the Philadelphia Athletics and Detroit Tigers won their last pennants and in the world's series the Pirates were returned winners. It being the third straight defeat in the blue ribbon event of the diamond for the Tigers.

Since that year the Giants have won eight pennants in the National league, Brooklyn and Cincinnati, two each; Boston, Philadelphia and Cincinnati, one each; St. Louis, Detroit, New York and Chicago, one each.

In the series intervening between Detroit's failure in the world's series of 1909 and Washington's victory over the Athletics this year, American league clubs have won the highest honors eleven times, Red Sox four, Athletics three, White Sox, 1st
