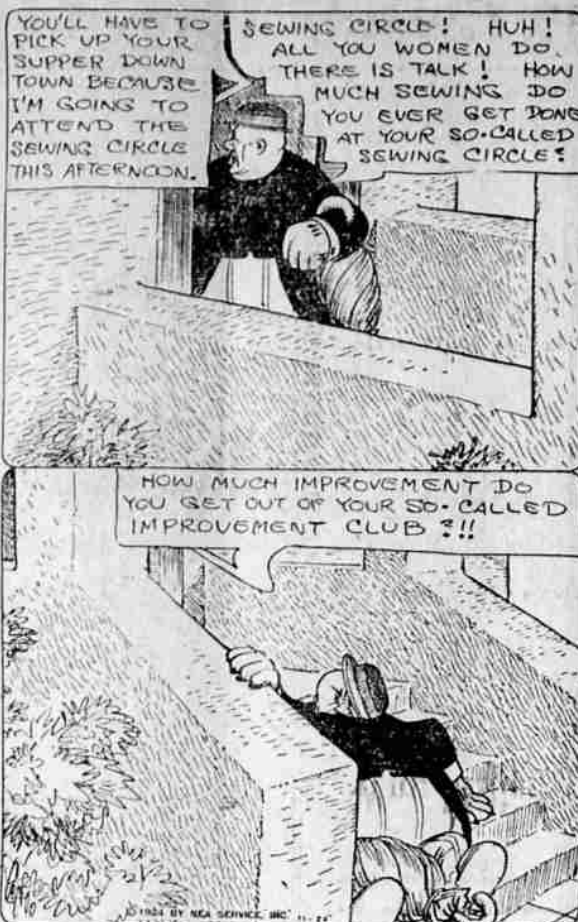

Loan Budget Reduced

ALBANY, Ore. — Albany county's budget for 1925 was decreased \$1128.46 by the budget committee and yet all was extended to November 1st through increase of appropriations because \$100,000 in road bonds were retired during the year. The committee allowed \$600 for Red Cross work; \$1200 for partial survey of the San Juan pass road; \$5000 for the county fair in place of \$1500 and \$2500 for a thirty-acre tract of three districts. The budget total is \$235,988 as compared to \$237,124.16 for the present year.
