Valuing U. S. Railroads Slow and Costly Task

WASHINGTON. (AP)—Completion of the groundwork of valuing America's railroads, which the Interstate Commerce Commission has been carrying on since 1914, is not yet in sight.

When the work will be brought up to date, officials point out, depends largely upon when congress makes the necessary funds available. So far, the commission has spent some \$25,000,000 in the task of primary valuation, and the expense to the railroads themselves has been heavy.

Primary valuation, which forms the basis for the commission's proposed railroad's present-day worth, is now 90 per cent completed, with respect to making up the original reports. These reports are reviewed and corrected. This latter work is now 50 per cent completed. After the tentative valuation reports are served on a railroad, it may file exceptions to the commission's figures and be given a hearing. The commissioners determine both tentative and final valuation. If a road accepts the tentative valuation—no hearing is necessary.

After completion of the primary valuation figures for the country's railroads, the commission's officials say, the work of valuation will still go on, as railroads are continually adding equipment, improving property and being subject to changes in their financial affairs. These figures must be kept current, as a basis for rate-fixing.

Soviet Russia's Budget Three Times Amount of Trade Income

MOSCOW. (AP)—Soviet Russia's budget for the coming year amounts to \$1,500,000,000, but its income from state industry and trade is only \$500,000,000. During the first eight months of this year only \$2,500,000 of this sum was realized, of which industry contributed a profit of \$2,100,000 and trade about \$400,000. These revenues, small as they are, show a slight improvement over those of last year and are derived principally from the export of grain and the production of sugar and oil.

Hints for the Housewife

HOME MADE CHILI SAUCE:
This is a good time to buy tomatoes for preserving. The season for them is about over and there are plenty that cannot be used for slicing which are to be had at a reasonable price. Very fine tomatoes are especially desirable for chili sauce, which can be served with meat or used to flavor gravies or soups.

Wash and quarter ten quarts of tomatoes, place them into a large enameled ware preserving kettle, the vitreous surface of which will not be affected by the tomatoes. Simmer until they draw their own juice, then boil for an hour. Press through an enameled ware colander so that the skins are removed. Then add the following, chopped: three one stalk of white celery, two dozen onions, two green peppers and one dozen red hot peppers. Also, three cupfuls granulated sugar, one cupful of salt and one cup of vinegar. Blend thoroughly. The one-half pound of mixed pickling spices in a cheese cloth and boil in the mixture gently for four hours. Bottle while hot and seal securely.
