All these cities are being asked to take care of the survey in definite parts of the county. Details which lie at some distance from the chamber of commerce will be taken care of by the local granges. Other business discussed included the voting of an appropriation for the Old Oregon Trail, the approving of the plan of a permanent county exhibit, which Dr. Poy has been working for, and the decision to erect large sign boards proclaiming the Grande Ronde valley to all tourists and travelers, at its three entrances.

This last suggestion was made by Dr. Poy and met with much enthusiasm on the part of the local group. They immediately voted to erect the sign board at the Pyle canyon entrance, while Dr. Poy and Floyd McKennon offered to see that similar boards were placed where the Wallows highway winds into the valley and at the

western end of the Old Oregon Trail.

EUGENE OFFICE ROBBED

EUGENE, Ore.—A daring hold-up was staged by an unmasked robber at the office of the American Railway Express company at the Southern Pacific station here when \$25 was taken from the safe after W. J. Russell, clerk, had been forced into a small room. The robber entered an automobile outside the office and with a companion drove rapidly from sight.

Mr. Russell told the police that a man 40 or 45 years old and roughly dressed entered and asked to have a suitcase sent to Redding, Cal. After ascertaining the charges he asked if the clerk could change a \$20 bill and as the latter opened the safe the man drew a revolver and forced Russell into the small room adjoining.

The police have little to work on, according to Chief Judkins.

BILL PAYMENT REFUSED

EUGENE, Ore.—The Lane county court made an order refusing to pay the bill of M. G. Nease of Portland for \$24,515.61 for cutting timber this year, living as a reason that Mr. Nease failed to conform to provisions of his contract and failed properly to cruise many tracts upon which he reported.

Mr. Nease was employed a year ago by Emmett Sharp and L. N. Ronney, ex-commissioners, who were recalled last spring to cruise 100,000 acres of timber land in Lane county each year for four years. The bill was for this year's work. A fight was made against the contract entered into with Mr. Nease by Commissioners Sharp and Ronney and the question entered into the recall campaign against them. It was stated here that Mr. Nease would take the case to court at once.

ASHLAND TO WIELD AX

ASHLAND, Ore.—Mayor-elect Johnson and the new councilmen who will take office here January 1, contemplated several changes in city officials, according to present indications.

Orlo Esterling, city electrician, will resign. It is reported, to start a rock-crushing plant near this city January 1. Friends of Captain Jack Malone, who recently returned from United States army service in the Philippines, said he would be the new city electrician. Other changes which it was reported the new officials were planning will be made in the personnel of the fire department, the police force and the water works department.

EXPLOSION INJURES MAN

LEBANON, Ore.—Albert Conner was placed in the Lebanon hospital in a critical condition as the result of burns received from an explosion of gasoline used in building a fire in a kitchen stove. He poured some gasoline on kindling to start the fire in the stove, and when he touched a match to it the stove was blown to fragments. There was scarcely a spot on his body that was not badly burned. The whole end of the room was blown out by the explosion and Mr. Conner jumped out through a window with his clothes on fire.

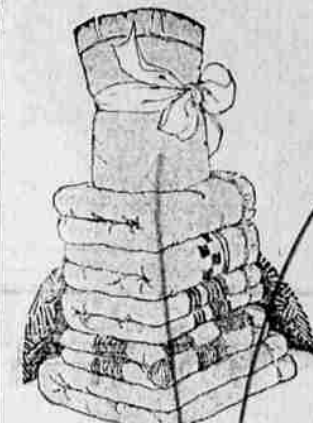
