## Hints for the Housewife

**THE HAPPY COMBINATION**  
Pork and apples go so well together that it is rather unusual for pork to be served without apple sauce. But the art of preparing them together, their flavors intermingling by far surpasses the old method of cooking them individually. The new way of combining them is worth while knowing and trying.

Select chops from the loin or ribs. Dip each in egg which has been beaten with one tablespoon out of milk, then dip in fine dry bread crumbs and brown quickly in a pan with plenty of hot fat. Remove the chops and place in an enamel ware baking dish, which is so attractive and dainty in appearance that it can be brought to the table and used as a serving dish. Dust the chops with salt pepper and a little thyme. Dip on each chop half an apple cut crosswise and cover fat and juice. Pour over all half a cupful of boiling water and set in a hot oven to bake until the apples and pork are tender, adding more water if necessary. Garnish with parsley when serving.

## DAM WILL AID MINING WORK

WASHINGTON (AP)—American's war time president is to have an enduring memorial in Wilson Dam at Muscle Shoals, to be completed late in the summer of 1925.

The project, deemed an engineering achievement second only to the Panama canal, was 82 percent completed on Oct. 1, the date of the last formal report. An appropriation of \$7,000,000 more will be required from congress. The total cost, with eight generators installed, will be \$45,500,000, and the dam will be capable of producing power enough to meet summer demand. It will have an ultimate capacity of 600,000 horsepower, over the disposition of which a bitter controversy is raging in congress.

Wilson dam will eventually create an artificial lake, extending upstream in the Tennessee river about 12 miles with an average width of three quarters of a mile. The dam proper is considered the largest in the world and is a mile long, 137 feet high and covers 29 acres. The work is under the general supervision of Major General Harry Taylor, chief of army engineers with Lt. Col. George L. Spaulding in immediate charge of construction forces.

Some 230,000 horsepower of hydro-electric generating apparatus will be ready by next summer. A power house, 1250 feet long, 160 feet wide and 124 feet high, will be in use. A two stage lock for navigation, with a total lift of 95 feet, comes out of the project.

Surplus waters during flood periods in the river will be passed through 55 steel flood gates, each 25 feet high and 18 feet wide. The dam or spillway section is 2050 feet long, 95 feet high from the river bed, 104 feet high from the base. Thirteen special spillways equipped with butterfly valves will pass surplus water during normal flow on the river.

Wilson Dam is officially known as "Dam Number Two," and is one of the three projected in the Tennessee river at Muscle Shoals. Dam Number One is a small paying dam, not yet authorized, to be two miles below Wilson dam, with an estimated cost of \$1,000,000 and Dam Number Three is a proposed power and navigation dam, not yet authorized, 13 miles above Wilson dam, with an estimated cost of \$25,000,000.

After all proposed improvements are completed, engineer officers point out, the Tennessee river will be navigable from the Ohio river to Knoxville, Tenn.

The stretch through which the river flows is rich in mineral, timber and agricultural resources, and would be greatly benefited by adequate river transportation facilities. The principal obstruction to navigation are the shoals in the Muscle Shoals area, and completion of Wilson dam will be the first great step towards opening up that region to water development.

**German Makers of Toys**  
From the Tin Soldiers. NUREMBERG (AP)—The little tin soldier for this year's Christmas in Germany has given way to aerobats, black and white mechanical dolls, various kinds of toy radio sets, and miniature housekeeping outfits with kitchen, dining room, living room, bed room, parlor and bath complete.

What few soldiers one sees are made of wood, owing to the high cost of metal. Although their uniforms of paint are just as bright as ever, and the officers and soldiers just as dignified and pretentious looking as of old, the tin soldier has been replaced for the most part by other toys. The equipment of the tin soldier and his army are not of tin, but of any material of their own making.

One of the season's novelties is a colored toy, made for export chiefly to the United States, which plays a mouth organ when one squeezes his body.

There has been an unusual call for mouth organs, especially from America, dealers say, and German manufacturers worked overtime last summer to supply the demand.

## German Pedestrians Jay Walkers De Luxe

BERLIN (AP)—Berlin is having a hard time putting through its new traffic regulations, which for the most part are patterned after American models. In fact this capital, in which cabinet crises are as frequent as the uninteresting, is now developing what may be termed a traffic crisis. Next to campaign news the discussion pro and con of the new regulations for vehicles and pedestrians occupied most space in the daily press.

The difficulty seems to be twofold: First, the lack of discipline of the pedestrians, and second, the unorganized administration of municipalities, buses, electric cars, buses, bicycles, and horse-drawn vehicles in the streets.

The Berlin pedestrian regards it as his inalienable right to cross the street whenever and however he pleases. He will throw himself into the confused jumble of vehicles of every description in the middle of the street and insist upon crossing without waiting till he reaches a street intersection. Until the German can be taught to tow to the same rules when he is out walking as govern his progress when he is riding, the enforcement of traffic regulations will be rendered illusory.

**Sales Body Is Planned.**  
HOOD RIVEN, Or.—C. King Benton, member of the committee of five growers, who spent last winter working on plans for organizing a Pacific northwest cooperative apple sales marketing plan for Wenatchee, where an orchardists' conference will be held during two days.

Mr. Benton said he had just received word from the Washington State Chamber of Commerce, which backed last winter's plan, that representatives of the various fruit sections met together at the Wenatchee gathering and ascertain sentiment for a renewal of co-operative plans at the present time.

**Manila Government May Aid Needy Students in America**  
MANILA, (AP)—The appointment of a Philippine government representative on the Pacific Coast of the United States to look after the interests of Filipinos, especially young immigrants who are seeking employment to support themselves while at college, is under consideration by interior officials in Manila.
