KERRY HUNTER IS SHOT
GRANTS PASS, Ore. — Dewey Dixon of Kerry was accidentally shot in the head by his companion, John Barlow, while they were hunting on Mt. Hood mountain, 20 miles from the town of Elmer from Selma. Dixon was in a local hospital in serious condition but it was believed he would recover. The bullet from the .20 rifle struck him under the chin, piercing his jaw and came out under the ear. The accident occurred at 11 o'clock and a companion carried him to Selma, where he received medical attention.

An improvised stretcher was made and E. F. Crochell, Elmer, Elton Shulzberger, and Ted Lo, who packed him four miles over the mountain trail. He finally was placed on a sled and taken to Selma. The wounded man did not lose consciousness at any time and showed great fortitude. His parents, Mr. and Mrs. Fred Larson, live at Kerry.
