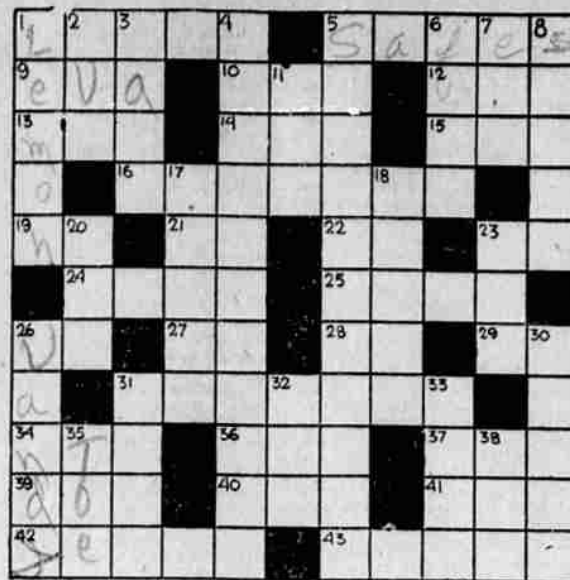

THREE ACCIDENTS FATAL

SALEM, Ore.—There were three fatalities due to industrial accidents in Oregon during the last week, according to a report prepared by the state industrial commission.

The victims were Clarence Hagalis, Birkfield, logger; James Holbrook, Oregon City, laborer; and Marcell Laffan, Glenwood, logger. Of the 572 accidents reported, 428 were subject to the provisions of the workmen's compensation law, 80 were from farms and corporations that have not joined the act, and four were from public utility corporations not subject to state protection.
