Here's Something We Have Always Wanted to Find Out.

How do movie stars "rest" between scenes, or rather, what do they do with themselves while waiting for the technical staff to prepare the set for the next scene? A visitor to Paramount's Long Island studio recently gathered the following interesting information on this subject.

Thomas Meighan works himself up to such a pitch in almost all of his scenes that he has to walk around the set for a minute to calm down before seating himself.

Ernest Torrence, one of the hardest workers at the studio, immediately seats himself alongside of his director and, while the technical staff is getting the set ready goes over the next scene, working out the details and striving for new ideas. Presently, these short sessions between the director and Mr. Torrence result in the building up of a scene from what ordinarily would be just an incident in the picture to something containing some very interesting action.

Bebe Daniels, naturally vivacious, almost always asks the orchestra to play some light, jazzy air. Miss Daniels claims that pep music makes her forget the terrific glare of the lights, the frequent retakes and the strain of action before the camera. In fact, she says that she is willing to work almost any hour of the night if she is promised a musical program after each scene.

Richard Dix plunges into every scene he makes with great enthusiasm. But after it is over he immediately relaxes and one can always find him off on the sidewalk somewhere joking with everyone from the property boy to the director.

Mary Astor always has her mother behind the camera watching the scenes being taken, and after each bit of action Mary goes to Mrs. Astor and gets her opinion on her work. Mrs. Astor also keeps the script of the picture with her and, with Mary, carefully goes over each successive scene as that when Mary again steps in front of the camera, she not only knows just what she has to do.
