## Blanche Sweet Scales Heights In Role of "Tess."

Blanche Sweet holds fair to win for herself the title of the screen's outstanding interpreter of emotional roles. It is not so many months since her "Anna Christie" was being hailed on all sides as one of the particularly bright spots in a year notable for illustrious pictures and performances.

"With Anna, I had to portray a character who had not so much of the woman left in her. Tess, on the other hand, as all women, to begin with—fall down and despondent. In fact too much so for her own good.

"The greatest contrast in the two roles lies in the fact that it is the very quality that Anna lacked—womanliness—that wrecks Tess' life. There is not enough masculine hardness in her character; she has too much unadulterated womanhood in her; and it does not pay to be too simple-charactered in a complex world like ours."
