

ACTIVE MOORS HAVE HAREMS

LOS ANGELES (AP).—The absence of civilization in the southern provinces of the Philippines is attributed to the lack of home life and the practice of polygamy among the native Moors. Mrs. Carl M. She is arrayed in her wedding garments, frequently of gaily colored materials, and a veil, many heads and girls and then locked in a tomb, room, where she is guarded by some male relative. The Hindu, Mohammedan priests, recite long ceremonies over the head of the groom. The bride and groom then exchange long distance messages through a barred window, but not until after repeated monies continuing through several days and nights, are they permitted to see each other. They are housed sufficiently to set up an establishment of their own.

When a woman marries, the groom or his family gives a dowry. If she runs away from her husband and it is proved that he treated her cruelly, she keeps the dowry, whether it is cattle or money. But if she is unfaithful and runs away to another man, she must return not only the dowry, but the amount. There are a few unfaithful wives.

LACK OF WHEAT HITS BULGARIA; WAR BREAD USED

SOFIA, (AP).—Owing to the shortage of wheat, war bread is the rule in Bulgaria. White bread is almost prohibitive in price. Under the direction of the food director, re-established in Bulgaria six years after the war, the black bread is a mixture of wheat, rye and corn.

The scarcity of wheat is due in a large measure to the large measure to the large amount of wheat turned over to Jugoslavia under the recent agreement to pay to that country 200,000,000 leva in addition to the Jugoslavian share in the general reparations for military requisitions. When it appeared, a few weeks ago, that Bulgaria would be unable to pay half of that amount in kind without running the risk of depriving her own population of the necessary amount of bread, Jugoslavia consented to accept half of that amount in kind in currency.

The feeding of the cities is placed under the charge of a food director in Sofia, who has subordinate food administrators in all the cities.

Under an order just published, the subordinate food administrators are instructed to provide for the feeding of their respective cities, even if they are obliged to purchase grain supplies at a price fixed

by them, especially in cases where the dealers refuse to sell at the market prices. Bread is sold at about twice the price which it brought when the present government came into power.

With the exception of Shaw's Saint Joan, there is today no new outstanding dramatic production to be seen in Berlin, and reviews and moving picture houses monopolize the theatrical advertising.

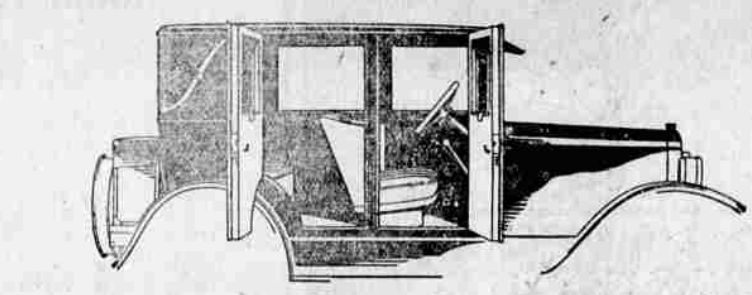
