BASEBALL MEN SEEK HARMONY

Settlement of Grievances Between Landis and Johnson Expected Today.

CHICAGO. (By the Associated Press) — Settlement of all grievances existing between Kenesaw Mountain Landis, baseball commissioner, and President Ben Johnson of the American league is expected to be reached when the 16 club owners of the American and National leagues reconvene here Wednesday in the joint session postponed in New York a week ago.

Friday in the joint session postponed in New York a week ago. Prior to the opening of the joint meeting, Cal Jaron Pappert of the New York Americans, E. S. Barnard, president of the Cleveland club, and President Theo. Shibe of the Philadelphia Athletics, constituting the American league peace committee, will extend the olive branch to Commissioner Landis at his office in an attempt to effect a reconciliation between him and the American league executive. After this meeting the club owners will go into session to transact the business of the league at their adjourned New York session. If there was a baseball storm brewing Tuesday night there was no indication of it at the headquarters of the American league or at Commissioner Landis' office. Johnson to Be Present. President Johnson, returning from his vacation, is expected to be present at the meeting for the purpose of paying

a personal call to President Bell of the St. Louis Americans, who has been ill for several weeks, said he had no statement to make. He ordered interviewers, however, that he would be present at the meeting, the first over which Commissioner Landis has presided since their break in relations. President Johnson attended the adjourned New York meeting but the commissioner was absent on account of the illness of his wife.

Intimation that Commissioner Landis might resign if Johnson remained as president of the American league were discounted in baseball circles Tuesday night. Everywhere the statement was made that the principal business before the meeting will be to bring Johnson and Landis together and urge more co-operation between Johnson, Landis and President Heydler of the National league, composing the baseball advisory council.

Should Consult Colleagues. The claim was made in some quarters that Commissioner Landis, in his handling of baseball affairs, had not taken President Johnson and Heydler into his confidence as much as certain club owners had wished. These club owners hope to convince Commissioner Landis that he should consult with other members of the advisory council before deciding important issues, particularly those affecting the major leagues. The resolutions adopted at the meeting at New York, upholding Landis' administration and giving him vote of confidence, will be presented at Wednesday's session. Whatever action the commissioner will take on these resolutions is known only to himself, but the remarks he is expected to make to the 16 club owners probably will be worth hearing, his admirers say. Wherever major league club owners gather, trade talk prevails, but so far the only deal on the fire is the one involving Urban Shooker, veteran St. Louis American spit-
