High Prices in France Laid to Grasping Trusts

Paris (AP) — Trusts, which heretofore have caused little loss of sleep to the French, have suddenly become great bogaboos to the Socialists in the Chamber of Deputies. These business organizations, patterned on German and American methods, are coming in for some scathing observations during the debates on the high cost of living.

Trusts, said Deputy Comptroller-Morel in a recent speech, limit production and fix prices. He cited the "diminishing number of firms in several basic industries to prove that gradually the tin, steel, fuel, electric, chemical and food firms are being organized.

This practice, M. Comptroller-Morel said, is resulting in France in the stifling of competition and an oppressive cost in handling goods. He gave figures on foodstuffs marketed in Paris to show that only a small proportion of the retail price went to the farmer, while half went for transportation, and the balance for handling and marketing.

PLANNING FOR COLLEGE HALL

OREGON AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE, Corvallis, Ore. (Special) — First detailed work on plans by architects for the new \$500,000 Memorial Union building to be built by students and alumni of O. A. C. will be started during Christmas week, members of the board of governors have just been advised.

Lee Thomas, recently chosen architect for the proposed structure, returned Monday from a tour of California made to study similar projects in that state. Coincident with his return announcement was made that Thomas has obtained the services of the chief draftsman and designer of the Haystack hotel in Spokane, considered one of the architectural achievements of the northwest. A New York specialist in design is to arrive in Portland during the week to aid in drawing the plans.

Proposals of arrangements for the new building have been received during the last few weeks by a committee of students and faculty headed by Lindsey Spight, of Hood River. This committee has endeavored to reconcile these proposals from the various organizations which will use the building, with the idea of making the memorial the scope of both utility and beauty.

The financial campaign committee composed of several met in session last week and drew plans for raising the necessary portion of the funds from graduates. A campaign among students is scheduled to begin January 14.

As the Memorial Union building has been in progress since 1911 when the students voluntarily voted to set aside \$5 apiece each term toward the building fund, more than \$20,000 toward the total has already been raised.

ELECT WOMEN TO BIG JOBS

CHICAGO (AP) — Women in nine of 12 middle-western states in the November election exactly doubled their representation in the lower house of the state legislature and increased from three to four their membership in the state senates. In two states there were no women legislators in the old or existing membership. A loss of six seats resulted in the four other states, although in three of these there were successful women candidates.

In the legislature of Illinois, Ohio, Missouri, Wisconsin, Nebraska, South Dakota, Oklahoma, Indiana, Kansas, North Dakota, Minnesota and Michigan, when they convene after January 1, will be found 22 women representatives, four state senators. Ohio will lead in number with nine—seven in the lower house and two in the upper.

The legislative women in the various states will total as follows: Illinois: House, three; Senate, one.
Ohio: House, seven; Senate, two.
Texas: None.
Missouri: House, one.
Wisconsin: House, three.
Nebraska: House, three.
Iowa: None.
