PEARL BEARING SHELLS NEED FOSTERING CARE

MANILA (AP)—The insular government has taken steps to protect the Philippine pearl beds and the pearling industry by ordering closed certain portions of the pearl fishing field around Mindanao and Sulu during alternate periods ranging from three to five years.

This action is said to be preliminary to a thorough regulation of the pearling industry which the government contemplates undertaking after a survey of all the pearl beds in the Philippine waters. The regulation of the industry by fixing open and closed seasons for fishing in various localities is urged as those engaged in the pearl fishing business on account of fears that the present beds in the Sulu seas may become exhausted in the near future.

HEALTH

Rheumatism is a vague term applied on the one hand to certain definite conditions and on the other to a number of indefinite aches and pains. Rheumatic diseases account for about one-sixth of the total absences among insured persons in England and the sick benefits expended amount to nearly two million pounds a year. In the United States, rheumatism was found to be the most serious disability among 600,000 persons examined by the Metropolitan Life Insurance company. Rheumatism is not a reputable disease in Oregon but it is safe to say that it is one of the most disabling diseases.

The difficulty of classification in this group of diseases, comprising many different disorders ranging from acute rheumatic fever in lambs and "franklin joints," is by no means a small one. A scheme is suggested which divides all "rheumatic" diseases into three main groups. Group "A" consists of acute and sub-acute rheumatism; group "B," so-called rheumatism not affecting joints, e. g., muscular rheumatism; group "C," chronic diseases of joints.

Rheumatism may be caused by infection in tonsils, nasal cavity or elsewhere. It is not cured by external applications but by the removal of the foci of infection. Persons of apparent intelligence have been known to carry a horse chestnut or a red kidney bean as a sure safeguard against rheumatism. Rheumatism can only be prevented by removing the possible source of infection.

Famous Church Gets Huge Bell
COLOGNE (AP)—Cologne Cathedral is soon to have the largest bell in the world. It will weigh over 25 tons.

The bell has been ready for shipment from a factory at Apollonia for over a year, but on account of the foreign occupation of the Cologne zone it was deemed impracticable before this to install it.
