The best result for a firm pumpkin filling is obtained by steaming. This eliminates most of the moisture which often makes the pie soggy, when other methods of preparation are employed.

Peel the pumpkin and remove the seeds. Cut into small pieces and steam in an enameled ware double boiler which will preserve the delicate color and flavor of pumpkin. When soft, drain off any water that may have accumulated and press through an enameled ware colander.

Beat two eggs thoroughly, add one half cupful brown sugar, one half teaspoonful salt, one half teaspoonful each of ground ginger and cinnamon. Pour over this mixture one pint scalded milk and then add the pumpkin and stir until thoroughly blended. Turn into a pie plate, which has been lined with any kind of pastry you prefer. Bake for about three-quarters of an hour, having the oven hot for the first ten minutes, then reducing the heat for the remainder of the baking period.

I could not reach it if I tried.

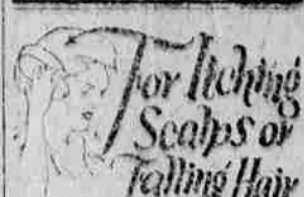
The only thing I have to spend
