METROPOLIS, Ore.—Walter Fisher of Astoria has sufficient ability to prove his innocence of the charge of holding and robbing the Citizens State bank of Metropolis of \$2000, despite the fact that he was positively identified there by E. C. Sanders, cashier, who was forced into the vault and tied hand and foot.

Fisher was also identified by L. E. Gavin, Stankin storekeeper, as the man who robbed the Gacia-Wheeler store at Gladbrook, binding both proprietors and leaving Wheeler in a fainting condition as a result of which he is still too ill to appear as a witness at the trial which will start Monday before Judge Duffy. Jay Upton, attorney for Fisher, said he would endeavor to prove his client was not in central Oregon when the crime was committed.

DISMISSAL OF LINDSEY PROTESTED BY ALUMNI

DENVER, (AP)—A telegram of protest against the reported action taken by the state board of administration of Kansas in dismissing Dr. H. Lindsey, chancellor of the University of Kansas, following charges preferred against the educator by Governor J. M. Davis was sent to Governor Davis Sunday by the Kansas university alumni of Denver.

The telegram sent by the Denver group stated the Denver alumni were "shocked" at the "hasty action and snap judgment taken in so vital a matter," and suggested "a thorough public, impartial investigation."

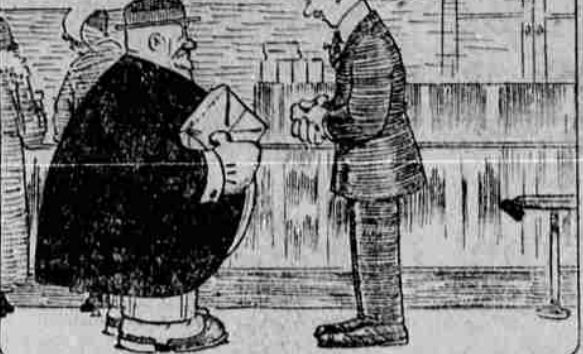
