U. S. Building Totals Nearly Six Billions

(Continued from Page 1.)

From 20 per cent last year to 5 per cent in March, giving an increase for the first quarter of 11 per cent. A sharp slump occurred in April when the volume of permits issued was 1 per cent less than for the corresponding month of 1923.

Summer Season Dull. "There was another slowing up in July and August when gains were out to 2 and 3 per cent respectively, but September revealed an 8 per cent increase.

"In October New York, Chicago, Los Angeles, Milwaukee and several other larger cities began to show

evidence of more normal operations, and the gain for the entire country was reduced to 2 per cent. A further downward swing by New York in November, amounting to 47 1/2 per cent, was largely responsible for the 13 per cent decrease in the entire country.

Consistent gains. "During most of the year, building operations, as measured by permits issued and plans filed, gained steadily and in considerable volume in the East and South, while there have been almost continual losses, though of small volume, in the Far West and Central States.

New York Governor Asks Aid of G. O. P. Colleagues for Popular Government.

ALBANY, N. Y. (AP).—Alfred E. Smith was inaugurated Thursday as governor of New York for his third term.

"My aim and only wish is to give the state the best of which I am capable," Governor Smith declared, "and although the incoming state officials are not of the same political faith to which I belong, I am satisfied that we are all thinking alike."

Significance given the inauguration ceremony Thursday by the swearing in of the first third term governor since the days of De Witt Clinton in 1825.
