German Prefers Fatherland To Great Wealth in England

BERLIN (AP)—Dr. Max Waechter of Berlin is one of the most distinguished men in Germany since he announced he will not accept the \$1,150,000 left to him by his uncle, Sir Max Waechter, on condition that the nephew must become a British subject.

"I am a German and I shall continue to be one," Dr. Waechter said in discussing the bequest. He declared that he was always on good terms with his uncle, who became a naturalized Englishman, and that he is fond of England, but cannot see his way clear to abandon his nationality and homeland, as he is very happy in Germany.

Sir Max Waechter was a native of Berlin. He migrated to England in 1867 and was naturalized there eight years later. He recently died in London at the age of 87. He amassed an immense fortune and spent much time and money in advocating a Pan-European movement.

Australia Gives Reciprocal Tariff With Canada Mingled Reception

MELBOURNE, Australia. (AP)—Although the reciprocal tariff with Canada was received first with enthusiasm and was ratified by the federal parliament by a vote of 25 to 7, the resulting business circles now feel less buoyant.

The Tariff Board reported as follows: "The proposals are admittedly of greater immediate benefit to Canada than to Australia. Railroads and carriers are the only lines which include a bunch of the families Universal Ranch Riders."
