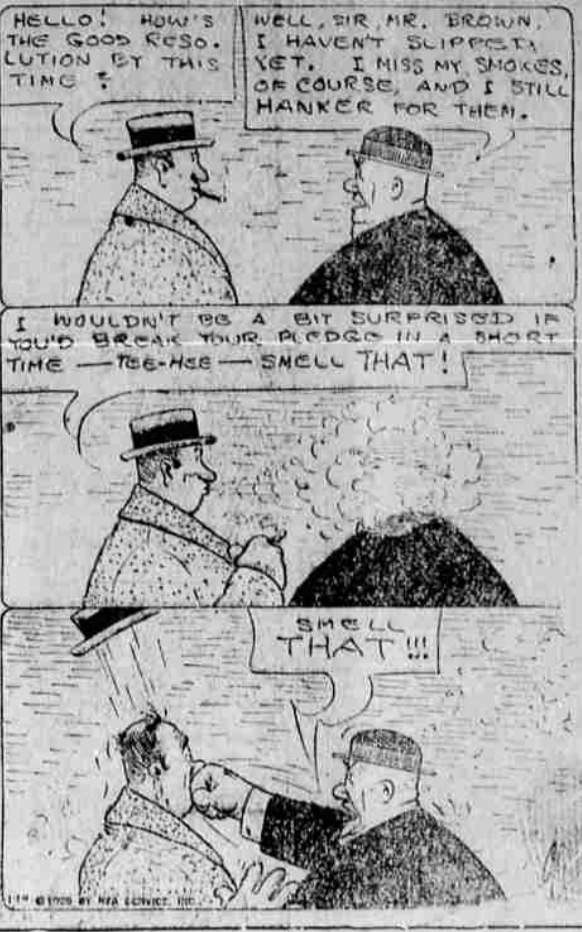

## MODERN HEALTH METHODS USED IN PALESTINE

JERUSALEM (AP).—That Palestine, the land of many diseases, can become a land of health, was the sermon preached during "Health Week" introduced into this country by an American organization. The lessons of health were taught by word of mouth through lectures in schools, synagogues and churches. They were made real by slides and motion pictures, and were popularized by specially prepared leaflets and articles in the Hebrew and Arabic press. The campaign was carried to practically every town of any size and to numerous Arab villages and Jewish agricultural settlements.

Proposed by Dr. Simon Tammenbaum of New York, Palestine director of the Hadassah Medical organization, whose hospitals and sanitary activities are supported by the Women's Zionist Organization of America, "Health Week" rapidly gained the interest of leaders of the Jewish, Christian and Moslem communities and the unofficial support of the Palestine government. The week was divided into five days—Hygiene day, Baby day, Food day, Microbe day and Recreation day.
