Filipinos in Hawaii Show Turf and Prosperity

HONOLULU (AP)—The industrial and financial progress of Filipinos in Hawaii has reached the point where the establishment here of a bank with capitalization of \$100,000 by Filipinos seems advisable, asserts Caytona Ligo, Philippines resident labor commissioner, in his first annual report to Governor-General Leonard Wood.

Commissioner Ligo declares that the method of paying Filipinos on Hawaiian plantations is equitable, that living conditions on the whole are good, managers are showing a spirit of fairness to employees, and the Filipinos can save and accumulate considerable sums each month. Between \$60,000 and \$800,000 is sent back to the Philippines annually by laborers here, and other large sums are held in Hawaii as further savings.

TIILAMOOK STORE ROBBED

TIILAMOOK, Ore.—The Gilbert Mercantile company store located on the highway at Beaver, about 18 miles from here, was entered by robbers, the safe blown and \$100 in cash, some jewelry and checks stolen. The latter were valueless to the robbers.

According to John Aabitt, sheriff, who was called to Beaver, the job was apparently the work of two men. They gained entrance to the store through a window, drilled the safe and made good their escape. The explosion awakened a number of people, but a stiff northwest wind was raging and they attributed the noise to the breakers.

The sheriff was unable to find any trace of the robbers.

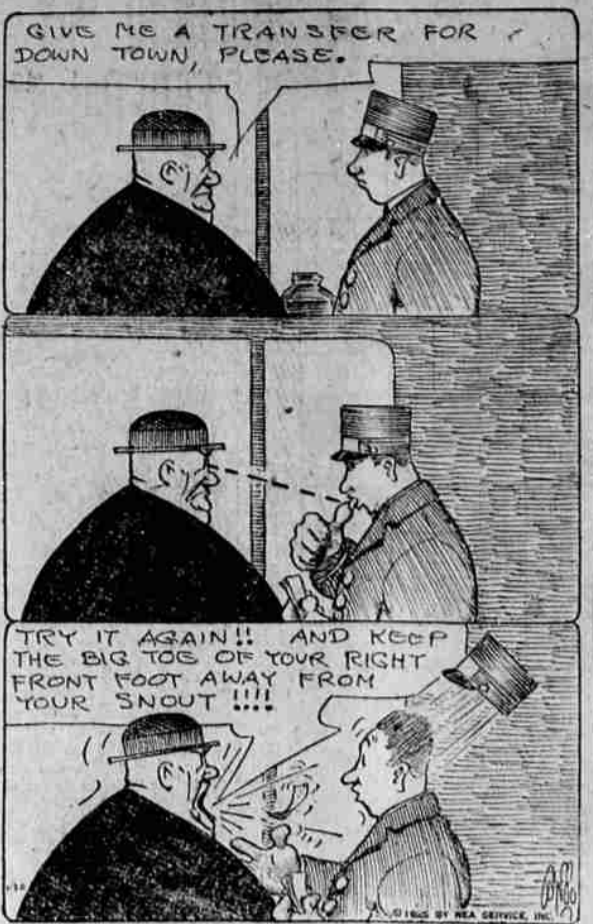

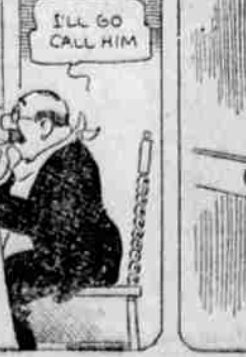
