Exports Through Port of Portland Recorded

Total Exports During 1924 Amounted to 1,396,937 Tons; First Barley Shipments for Several Years Made; England Received Most Exports.

PORTLAND, Ore.—(Special)—According to figures compiled by the Traffic Department of the Port of Portland the total exports for the year 1924 amounted to 1,396,937 tons compared with 1,261,258 tons in 1923 and 1,234,348 tons in 1922. Increases were shown in many items, the largest, however being in wheat shipments which increased from 521,571 tons in 1923 to 612,737 tons in 1924. Wheat shipments, however, were not as large as in 1922 when they were 715,228 tons. Wheat was sent to the same countries as in the previous year but the total amount sent to the United Kingdom was nearly twice that dispatched during the previous year while to the Oriental countries the amount was considerably less.

Holland, Belgium, Denmark, Norway and Sweden with smaller shipments to the other countries. The movement of canned goods also shows an increase over the two previous years, the figures for 1924 being 8719 tons, for 1923, 4921 tons and 1922, 5874 tons. The greater part of the movement of this commodity is also to the United Kingdom with smaller shipments to Belgium, China, Germany, France, Japan and the Scandinavian countries. The shipment of dried apples is a recent movement from this port. During 1924 390 tons of this commodity were exported of which approximately half was delivered to the United Kingdom and the balance to the various other countries in northern Europe. This is a movement which should increase quite rapidly.

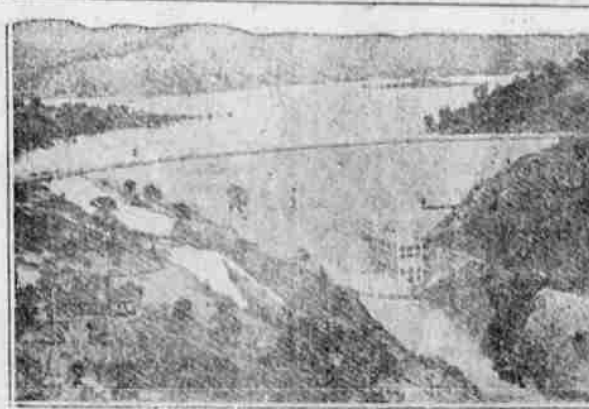

LATEST UNIT IN MODESTO-TURLOCK IRRIGATION SYSTEM

The Don Pedro dam and reservoir, the most recent addition to the irrigation system enjoyed by the Modesto-Turlock (Calif.) Irrigation Districts, demonstrated the belief of its builders by imposing sufficient water to insure this section of California adequate, late irrigations, despite the longest drought on record. The Don Pedro dam is the highest structure of its type in the world. It has a capacity of impounding 250,000 acre-feet of water, forming a lake fourteen miles long and one mile wide. The dam rises 285 feet from the river bed and is 1,000 feet long. It is 16 feet thick at the top and 117 feet thick at the base.

Austria, To Enforce Labor Pact Elsewhere, Adopts Novel Act

VIENNA (AP)—As a penalty for not ratifying the Washington agreement on the eight-hour day, Austria will inflict an extra duty on imports in the case of countries

which have either failed to ratify the Washington labor agreement, or which maintain labor conditions falling considerably below those prescribed by the Washington pact. Under this unique act, the government may, with the approval of the finance committee of the National Council, raise the customs rates by not more than one-third in the case of the countries above mentioned. The act was proposed by Dr. Otto Bauer, former foreign minister and leader of the socialist delegation in the Austrian parliament.

Jugoslavia Outlaws Communists; Declines to Recognize Russia

BEGRAD (AP)—The communist party of Yugoslavia, parading under the name of "Party of the Independent Workers," has been outlawed by decree of the government. The party headquarters were closed, and the publication of the party organ, "The Workers in Chains," interdicted.
