

OTOSKEY HELD IN VIRGINIA

WALLOWA, Ore. (Special to the Observer) — Another chapter in the adventures of Jack Otoskey in Wallowa county was opened last week when the wrestler, prohibition agent, etc., was located on the coast of Virginia.

The tracing of Otoskey has occupied about a month, and has meant the sending of a number of telegrams by W. H. Spence in an effort to locate the fugitive. After his escape in this county he went to Pendleton. Deputy Sheriff H. Hoshing of Umatilla county, who was the "chief" in the prohibition raids last fall, has been on the trail of his former deputy, and had traced him as far as Spokane. He thence wandered east, evidently stopping at a number of points.

W. R. Frank, better known under his wrestling name of Jack Otoskey, came into the county last June to wrestle Noremarch. He was a clever mat artist but not strong enough for the local man. His former home was Kansas City, but for some reason he was forced to leave that section, states a local newspaper. Later he brought his wife into the valley, and together they collected evidence for their sensational raids of last fall. Last December he was indicted before the grand jury on a statutory charge. The officers are expected back from the east coast with the arrested man in about a week.

Instead of the tax amounting to \$1,112,245.84 it will be \$7,125,227.02. This increase was occasioned principally by an added levy at Sweet Home, where the Union high school district authorized construction of a gymnasium this year.

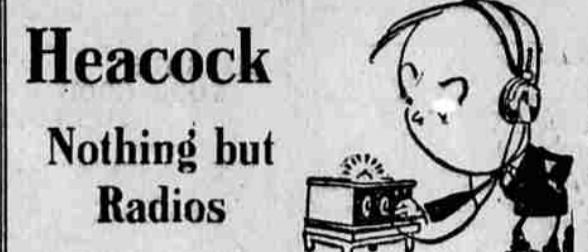
