1/2 cup gelatine (scant) or 1 1/2 tablespoons granulated gelatin.

1 cup sugar

Income Tax Facts

No. 18. Losses arising from "fires, storm, shipwreck, or other casualty or from theft" are deductible whether or not connected with the taxpayer's trade or business.

If a taxpayer's home or automobile is destroyed by fire, or if his summer bungalow is damaged by storm he may claim a deduction for the loss sustained. Allowance, of course, must be made for any insurance or other compensation received.

Loss of property by theft or burglary is an allowable deduction, and need not be incurred in trade or business.

As a general rule deductions for losses are allowed for the year in which sustained. A taxpayer may ascertain the amount of a loss sustained during a prior taxable year which he had not deducted from

gross income for that year. He may render an amended return for such preceding year including such amount of loss in the deductions from gross income, and may file with the Bureau of Internal Revenue a claim for refund of the excess tax paid by reason of failure to deduct the loss in his original return. A loss from theft or embezzlement occurring in one year and discovered in another is ordinarily deductible for the year in which sustained.
