January Shipments From Portland Show Increase

Intercoastal Outbound Shipments Double Tonnage Carried a Year Ago; Flour Shipments Increase More Than 500 Percent.

PORTLAND, Ore., (Special).—According to records compiled by the Traffic Department of the Port of Portland intercoastal outbound shipments for the month of January 1925 amounted to 27,598 tons. This is an increase of more than double the tonnage carried during January 1924 and nearly four times as much as January 1923.

Prize shipments in the intercoastal trade during this month amounted to 3,595,945 pounds compared with 2,129,806 pounds in January 1924 and 1,007,824 pounds in 1923.

Flour shipments to intercoastal ports amounting to 1,725,943 pounds compared with 727,159 pounds in January 1924 and 1,049,265 pounds in 1923.
