## FIVE-DAY WEEK IS SPREADING

PORTLAND, Ore. (Special)—Although curtailment of production of fir sawmills spread to all west coast districts during the past week, the reduced schedule has taken the form of a five-day week and therefore has not added stress to the unemployment of northwestern cities, according to reports from 41 employment service offices received at all headquarters here today. The five-day week curbing program, it is thought, will be only a few weeks duration.

Conditions in the pine districts of the inland Empire, where both logging and sawmilling are being resumed, are better than at any time this winter. Reports from the various 41 offices are as follows: Portland, Although there has been a steady demand for loggers during the past week, and more than 125 have left Portland daily for camps, this movement was due largely to the shifting of men rather than to any increased log production. The Midway Logging company at Stella, Wn., and the Ketchikan camps of the Eastern and Western Lumber companies were the only operations to be added to the active list during the week. Hundreds of construction workers are in this city waiting for work on the Nitron cut-off to be resumed. There are fewer unemployed men than at this time last month.

Aberdeen, High winds and heavy rains throughout the past week materially slowed up logging on Grays Harbor, while rough seas seriously hampered cargo shipping. There was no movement of vessels either into or out of the harbor for three days during the week and much lumber accumulated on docks despite the curtailment of production in local sawmills. Montana sawmills were closed down because of high water, and camps of the Rehder Bros. Logging company at Brady are down for the same reason.

Tacoma, The unemployment situation in Tacoma has improved slightly. Curtailment of production at local sawmills has not thrown any men out of work, and logging companies have added more than 295 men to camp payrolls during the past week. There continues to be a large over-supply of all kinds of labor but the situation is not so acute as it was one month ago.

Seattle, Heavy rains in Puget Sound districts last week caused a somewhat larger labor turnover in logging camps than for many weeks past. The Trout Creek Logging company at Index was the only closed camp which resumed operations. Its local mills are now operating five days a week and the South Seattle Mill company has closed down its night shift. Supply of all kinds of help is still in excess of demand.

Spokane, Because of heavy rains slash and high water, logging in the inland Empire is practically at a standstill. As soon as ground conditions permit, logging and hauling will be resumed and new camps opened. Several hundred loggers now in Spokane will return to camps beginning this week. Sawmills in the pine districts are now starting the season's run. Geldrick at Spokane and Humboldt at Newport resumed cutting last week. The supply of both skilled and unskilled help here is still greatly in excess of demand.

### Stevenson Newspaper Sold

CASCADE LOCKER, Ore.—The Skamania County Pioneer, official paper for Skamania county, published at Stevenson, Wash., has changed hands. W. W. Mokler, who has been owner and editor since May, 1923, has sold the paper to P. F. Willoughby, who already has taken possession and published his first edition this week. A special issue of the Pioneer will be published soon in the interest of the Skamania county chamber of commerce.

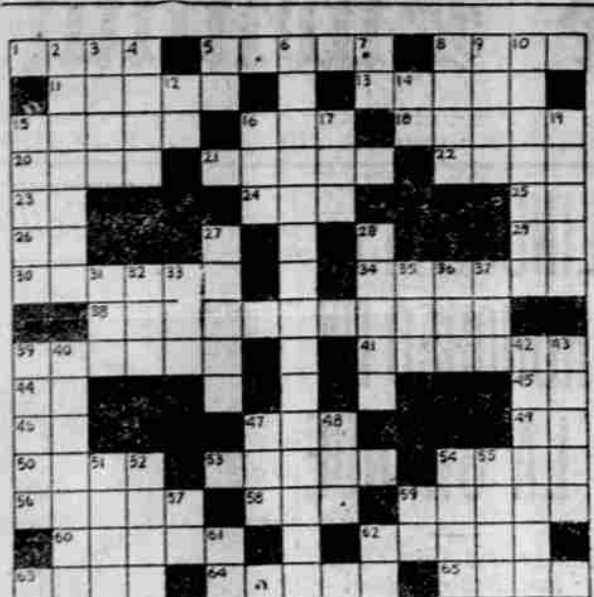

## Income Tax Facts

No. 25  
Deductions for contributions or gifts are limited to 14 per cent of the taxpayer's net income as computed without the benefit of the provisions of the law allowing such deduction. This means that from the total of all the taxable items there is subtracted all allowable deductions—business expenses, losses, taxes, etc.—except contributions, the remainder being the amount upon which the 14 per cent limitation is based.
