KANSAS LEAD THOUGHT FAKE

Man, Who Claims He Is Floyd Collins, Fails to Answer Minute Description of Entombed Man.

CONCORDIA, Kan. (AP)—Although persons directly connected with the rescue efforts at Sand Cave are convinced that Floyd Collins is a prisoner there, a man appeared at Haddam, Kan., late Wednesday and asserted he was Floyd Collins.

A telegram was dispatched by the man from Haddam to William B. Miller, reporter of the Louisville Courier-Journal at the cave.

"Tell mother I am all right and on my way home," the message said. It was signed "Floyd Collins."

The man said he caught a ride into town Wednesday afternoon with two farmers who told him of the imprisonment of Floyd Collins in Sand Cave.

He is about 39 years old, of light complexion, five feet five inches tall and weighs about 145 pounds.

He is being held under orders of Mayor F. W. Shearburn pending word from Lieutenant Governor Denhardt of Kentucky, in charge of the situation at Cave City.
