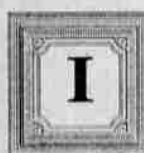

## INOCULATION OF 118 MADE

GOODING, Ida. (Special).—One hundred and eighteen employees, teachers and students at the state school for the deaf and blind were inoculated Monday in an effort to stop the epidemic of diphtheria discovered here Saturday. No new cases were reported, but one with suspicious symptoms is held under close investigation. Reports have not yet been received from the cultures sent for examination.

Of the four cases already discovered only one, the first, is beyond a mild stage. The school itself is under the strictest of quarantine regulations, no one being allowed to enter or leave, save the doctor.

Grade Crossing Problem. According to W. Holton, superintendent of the Second Division, and General Safety Agent J. P. Grodzki, of Portland, the greatest problem before the railroad now is auto accidents at grade crossings. "It is impossible at present to even think of eliminating the grade crossings because more than 250,000 exist in the United States and it would cost the enormous sum of 18 billion dollars to remove them," Mr. Grodzki stated to an Evening Observer reporter. 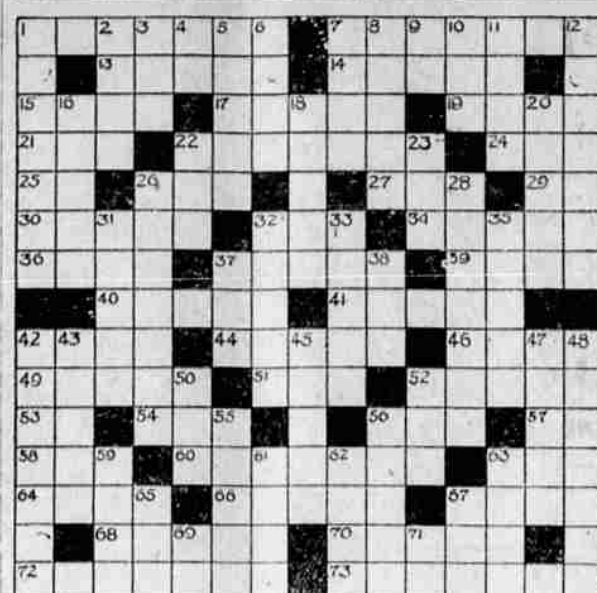
