PRUNE CAKE (By Mrs. A. G. Conklin) 1/2 cup of butter or a substitute, 1 cup of sugar, 1 cup of milk, 2 eggs, 2 cups flour, 1 teaspoon cinnamon, 3 teaspoon cloves, nutmeg, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1 large cup cooked dried prunes, cream butter and sugar, beat eggs separately, add the yolks, the spice and then the milk. Put in the flour and egg whites and last the prunes. Bake in a loaf and frost with boiled icing.

Sweden Saw Flowers, Green Fields on Xmas

STOCKHOLM (AP)—The Swedes are accustomed to snow and ice for Christmas, and the sleighs drive to church early on Christmas morning through snow-covered forests furnishing shelter from the cold northern winds, or over fields thickly covered with white, is the usual and highly appreciated thing. This year, however, the snowy landscape gave place to a springlike country where green grass, so unusual for the winter season, and even flowers, abounded.
