VERTORIA, B. C. (AP)—An attempt is to be made to capture a mate for Ursus Kermodei, a lonely white bear, the only one of its species known to be in captivity now housed in a new \$1000 home of its own at Beacon Hill Park. A report has been received from Princess Royal Island on the northwestern British Columbia coast, that bears of the same species are at large there. Smaller than polar bears, they have a limited habitat and, owing to the isolated and rugged character of the islands, it is almost impossible to capture the animals alive.

Arcade and American Legion Present Historic Film "Man Without a Country."

"Breathes there a man with soul so dead Who never to himself has said: This is my own, my native land"

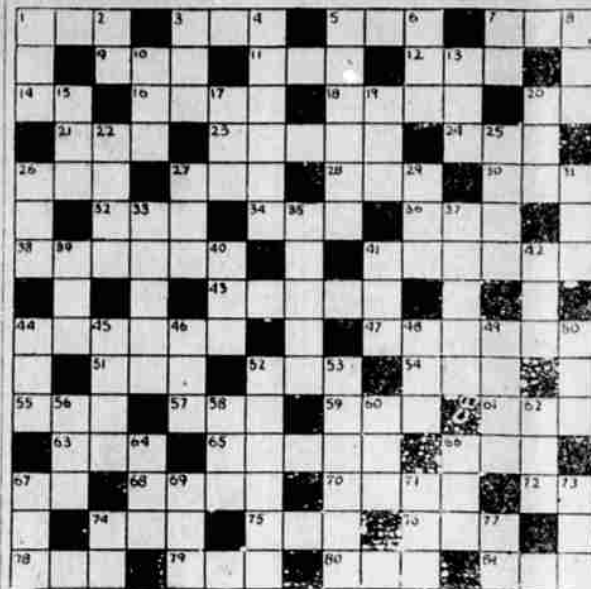
Philip Nolan's reading of Scott's immortal lines while on the battlefield "Constitution," banished from the United States and doomed to sail the seven seas until death because he damned his country, is one of the most touching scenes in the picture "The Man Without a Country" showing at the Arcade today under the auspices of the American Legion.

It is one of the most touching scenes—not most necessarily the most. Throughout the picture of Edward Everett Hall's masterpiece scene after scene has special merit—some touching the true value of patriotism, others delving into the very depth of one's soul and revealing things of a sacred quality.

Married one night and arrested the next morning, tried, convicted and sentenced to an "imprisonment" that permitted him never to see his young wife again, such was Philip Nolan's fate. "God, YOU know I didn't mean it," were the fervent words he uttered. He proved his statement later—but too late.

BUDGET APPROVED FOR EAST OREGON HOSPITAL NEEDS

PENDLETON, Ore. (Special).—A message received yesterday by Dr. W. D. McNary, superintendent of the Eastern Oregon State hospital, says that the joint ways and means committee of the legislature has approved of the entire budget for the local institution, including the sum of \$215,000 for a new wing. The appropriation has not yet passed the legislature but it is almost inevitable that the action of the ways and means committee is final so it is logical to expect passage of the building appropriation. It is the supposition that the new wing will extend back at an angle toward the east end of the institution and will extend back at a single toward the river. Final decision will rest upon the situation at the Salem asylum which is overcrowded. At the Pendleton hospital the east wing is devoted to male patients and the west wing to female patients. The new wing is needed in order to relieve the congestion at Salem.

According to Superintendent McNary the crowded condition of the hospital at Salem is severe and so things work on the new wing here will be rushed. If the measure passes it is believed that the architects will be at work within a month and actual construction work may start by June 1. The wing will be of the same type of construction as the present building.

TO EXPLORE NEVADA CITY

RENO, Nev.
