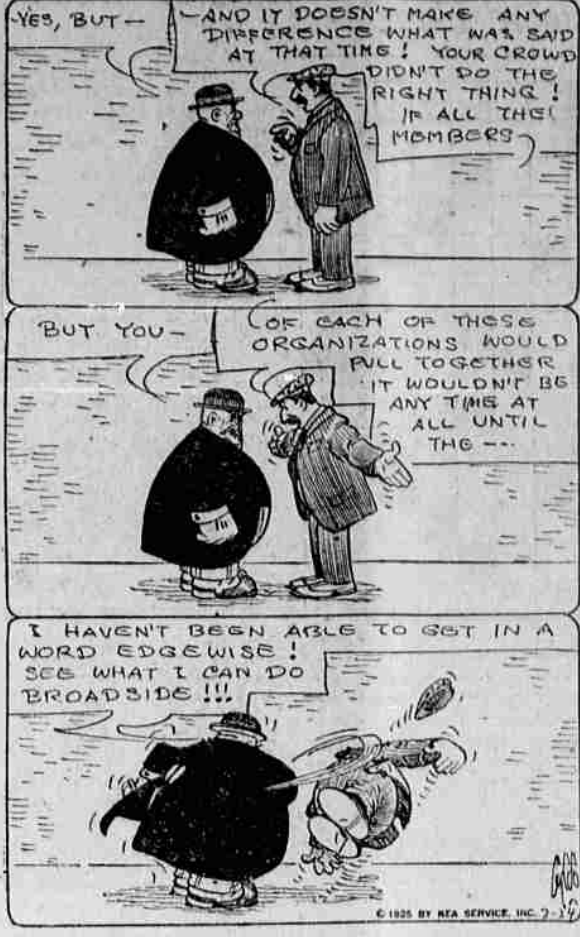

Desmond's Next Makes Him Real "He Man" Parson.

"The Measure of a Man," Universal feature, coming to the Star theater next Wednesday, is one of those gripping stories of a man, who, though inspired by kindly motives, realizes that the same strength by which the jungle beasts maintain supremacy is useful in dealing with mankind at times.

DWARFS' WEDDING BRINGS MOB AND TIES UP TRAFFIC

WEYMOUTH, England, (AP) — There was such a mob of uninvited guests at the recent wedding here of Miss Eliza Victoria Walbridge and Alfred Goodwin, dwarfs, and such a buzz of whispers among the throng that the notes became extremely embarrassing to the clergyman performing the ceremony. He had to call for silence five times and threatened to order everyone from the church excepting those of the bridal party.

Miss Walbridge is but three feet two inches in height while the bridegroom stood but three feet seven inches in his wedding slippers. The heads of the couple did not come up to the altar rails in Holy Trinity Church and nearly every one of the spectators stood on the seats with the hopes of getting a glimpse of the little man and his bride.

Hundreds fought their way toward the altar, while the crowd outside held up traffic for an hour or so and extra police had to be called to remedy the situation. The bride wore white satin and the bridegroom was dressed in a frock coat and carried a top coat. They were followed by a page and two bridesmaids, none of whom were dwarfs.

Animal Importer to Experiment With Raising Zebras in England

LONDON (AP) — Zebras from the wilds of Rhodesia are sent to be added to the animal collection of several of the vast British and Scottish estates, where they will be allowed nearly as much freedom as in their native haunts. Twenty-two zebras arrived in London recently for G. B. Chapman, an animal importer, who will have charge of the experiment of raising the little striped beasts in this climate.

Several pairs will be assigned to the grounds surrounding Chibham Castle, in Kent, owned by Edmund

Lewis, while others will go to H. Whitley's Primley Park, Paignton, Devon, and eight or ten others to Balfour Park, Lumbriaire, owned by Sir William Crook.

Free State Makes Examination
DUBLIN, (AP) — A distinction without precedent in the history of the British or Irish bars was conferred recently upon Kevin O'Higgins, Free State minister of justice, who without the formality of an examination, was called as a barrister, that is, given permission to plead in the Free State courts.
