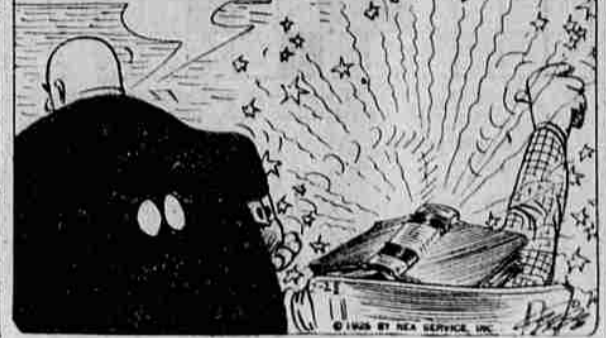

SWEDISH WOMEN ON EQUAL TERMS WITH THE MEN

STOCKHOLM (AP)—Sweden's working women have scored an important victory through the official recognition by the government of the principle of equal pay for men and women in the employ of the state. The recognition appears in the form of a recommendation submitted to the Riksdag by Minister of Finance Thorsson, along with the estimate for the next state budget.

In justifying his proposal Mr. Thorsson points out that the civil service law virtually gives women the same privileges and responsibilities as men, so far as the actual work is concerned, and it is only logical, therefore, that the salary of any given position should remain constant, whether the service is rendered by a man or woman.

What makes the victory for the women the more striking is the fact that the budget estimate, in spite of the strictest scrutiny of every item, will involve an estimated expenditure of \$11,000,000 more than last year. This means that, although no new or increased taxes are contemplated, all hopes of any early tax reduction must be abandoned.

Wild Sea Birds Come Back To Baltic Bathing Resorts

HAMBURG (AP)—Efforts to safeguard the bird life on certain islands in the North Sea are resulting successfully. Terns and gulls are coming back to the islands of Jordsand, Ellenbogen and Nordroog.

A century ago the Frisian Islands were a paradise for bird life. Naumann, the celebrated ornithologist, described them as having the appearance of a flake of foam floating on the sea because of the great number of nests, terns, gulls and other birds. But in the meantime the islands have become bathing resorts and throughout the summer are alive with pleasure seekers who have turned them into noisy amusement centers. Until recent years birds' nests were ruthlessly destroyed.

Secret Town Employers Guardian of War Memorial at Scotch Hill

ELGIN, Scotland (AP)—The town council has not erred on the side of extravagance, or upset any of the theories regarding Scotch Hill by appointing a caretaker to look after the town war memorial for two shillings and sixpence a week. For this sum the caretaker must—

Remove all withered flowers and leaves from the memorial; Carefully arrange the wreaths daily;

Prohibit the parking of motor cars near the memorial;

Prevent people from standing on the memorial steps, and see that the memorial and its surroundings are kept clean and neat.
