MANY BUSINESS SCHOOL MEMBERS AT UNIVERSITY

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Ore. (Special)—With an enrollment of 500 students, the school of business administration ranks first in point of numbers among the professional schools at the University of Oregon. The school of journalism is in second place with 227 majoring in this department, and the school of medicine, with 299 majors, is third, according to a classification of enrollment figures prepared by Registrar Carlton E. Spencer today.

The college of literature, science, and the arts, which embraces the departments devoted to the cultural and scientific subjects, has 1,281 students enrolled. It is the largest component part of the university, with the exception of the extension division. The total enrollment in the major schools of the university brings the number now in residence at Eugene and in the medical school at Portland to 2,814. The enrollment this year shows a 15 per cent increase over 1924 year.

Enrollment among the professional schools, in addition to those mentioned above, follows: school of architecture and allied arts, 188; school of education, 172; school of physical education, 112; school of music, 112; school of law 68, and school of sociology, 41. The school of sociology enrollment includes only the Eugene students. The Portland school of social work is a separate entity.

Registrar Spencer's report shows that since 1902, not an academic year has passed without an increase in enrollment over the year preceding.
