"Tarnish" at Arcade, Is Hailed As Great Film.

Director George Fitzmaurice has combined earnestness and observation in an unusual fashion in his latest production, "Tarnish," which is being shown at the Arcade Theatre. The film, a First National picture, sponsored by Samuel Goldwyn, is an adaptation of Gilbert Emery's stage play of the same name. Frances Marion is responsible for the picture.

The earnestness and observation of Mr. Fitzmaurice is hardly common in the modern trend of photodramas, simply because here we have a native drama of genuine vitality. "Tarnish" reveals the drama of youth. It centers around the flat next door, typically American and introduces rare values.

Its freshness of viewpoint is appealing to look upon there is no denying. Further, the reality of its people, two fine young people in love, and the crumbling of domestic strife caused by a foolish father, makes of the photoplay unusually significant feature. Briefly, the dramatic elements are furnished by a designing manieurist, who was one in love with the young man about to claim the charming heroine as his wife. The manieurist reveals the youth's past life, and the fact that she is carrying on a little philandering scene with the father of the girl.

Many McAvoy, as the young heroine, is charming and effective. Marie Prevost, in the role of the manieurist, is a dazzling and bewitching charmer of men's hearts, and Ronald Colman is most convincing as an earnest, romantic young man. There are also to be seen Norman Kerry, Harry Meyers, Phyllis Bonner, Albert Gran and Mrs. Ross Whyatt, all of whom make "Tarnish" a delightfully interesting picture.
