Dempsey Will Meet Former Pupil Soon

SAN FRANCISCO (AP)—Martin Burke, 25, New Orleans heavyweight, has been matched to meet Champion Jack Dempsey in an eastern city for a title fight within the next few months. It was announced here Thursday by Lew Diamond, Burke's manager. Diamond said that his announcement was sanctioned by Jack Kearns, manager of Dempsey.

Diamond expected that the bout would be held in July.

"I have been authorized by Kearns to get bids for the fight," Diamond said. "Dempsey and Kearns have both promised that the first man to be met is Burke. This will be one of the two final bouts in which Dempsey is to appear before closing his ring career. After Burke he will meet Tommy Gibbons. Burke is a former pupil of Dempsey's and is liked by the champion."

There are three possible sites for the fight, some say in Michigan, Philadelphia or New York.

University May Build New Basketball Court

UNIVERSITY OF OREGON, Eugene, Ore. (Special)—At a meeting of the athletic and finance committee having charge of a S. U. O. affairs, Randall Jones, president of the student body, was authorized to appoint a special committee to look into the feasibility of building a new basketball pavilion that will seat 5,000 spectators. The committee will also study means of financing the project.

Oregon at present has no adequate floor on the campus. All home games are played at the Eugene armory downtown. As the armory is often engaged for meetings, the basketball team cannot make continuous use of the structure during the season. Thus, the post-season championship series between Oregon and O. A. C., the first game of which was to have been played at the armory Friday was set back a day, as the armory will be used Friday night for a revival meeting.
