"The Beloved Brute" To Be Shown at Sherrys Today.

Many of the picturesque outdoor scenes of "The Beloved Brute," a picturization of Kenneth Perkins' famous novel of the same name, which will be shown at Sherrys theater last time today, were taken in Battlemake Canyon, twelve miles northwest of Chatsworth, California.

While the company was on this location, which has never before been used for motion picture purposes, a forest fire was raging in the neighborhood. The smoke of the conflagration settled down like a heavy cloud, at times obscuring the sun and making satisfactory photography impossible. The company worked under difficulties but stuck to the post even though the fire was approaching the district rapidly.

In the production, there is much horseback riding which requires a number of experienced horsemen. They worked calmly until the mules utilized in the packing from Chatsworth became nervous, then every horseman commenced to show equal nervousness.

They explained to J. Stuart Blanton, the director, that it is usually possible to drive a horse anywhere, even to his death, but that it is practically impossible to make a mule go to or remain in a locality where he senses danger. Through the action of the mules, the horsemen predicted a new forest fire in the locality of Battlemake Canyon, where only a spark from the Pasadena blaze would start a terrific blaze, owing to the dryness of the brush.

Mr. Blanton immediately gave orders to rush scenes at all possible haste that the camp might be abandoned and the company which included Marguerite de la Motte, Victor McLaglen and William Tunstall, return to the studio.

Foreigners in France May Not Own Pigeons

PARIS (AP)—The homing pigeon is a dangerous bird for the security of France when owned by foreigners, is the reason given in the preamble of a bill introduced by the government under the signatures of President Doumergue, Premier Herriot, Minister of War General Nollet and Minister of the Interior Chautemps, to the effect that hence forth none but Frenchmen born may own doves.

"Reasons of national defense," the bill begins, "has forced the government to pass the measure."

"The war of 1914-1918 has proved the very great services which homing pigeons can render as liaison agents between units of the French army, but it has also demonstrated the terrible ravages they can cause by giving information to the enemy, especially when they have been born on our soil or have been in France for some time," the bill says.

"Foreigners of any nationality are forbidden to have in France doves and homing pigeons and any person of French nationality desirous of being proprietor of such birds must first obtain the authorization of the prefect of his department."
