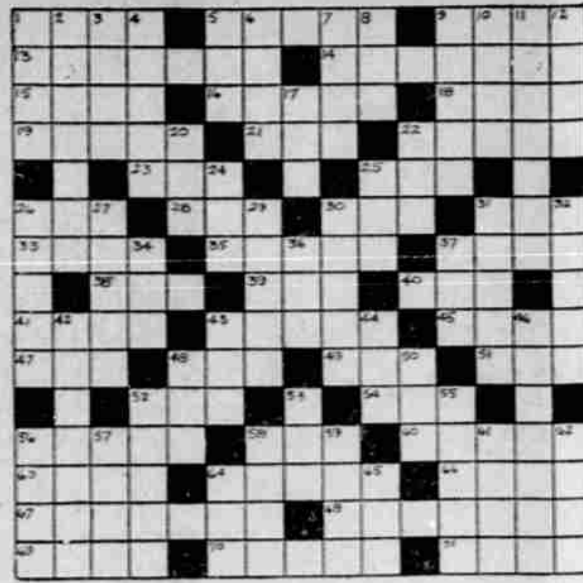

## RUBBER TREES MANY IN LUZON

MANILA (AP)—That Para rubber trees will flourish in the southern provinces of the island of Luzon within the typhoon belt, is the conclusion reached by A. W. Proutch, agent of the department of agriculture, who has just re-

turned from an extensive inspection trip through the provinces of Albay and Camarines Sur. After traversing the same region in the provinces where 12 years ago some 15,000 Para rubber trees brought from Singapore were planted, Mr. Proutch declared in his report to the department that he found hundreds of rubber trees that have grown to maturity and are now producing in the best way. "Some of these rubber trees were purchased by me in Singapore and brought to the Philippine Islands in 1912," said the report. "The government took a keen interest in this movement in planting rubber growing and I was employed several months in making a campaign in Camarines and Albay provinces to interest the people in the cultivation of the rubber tree. The work was all unobstructed and planned. They grow well and today many are large, matured trees.

In most cases the seeds were taken to cuttings of distant lands, particularly in the area which does the Para tree. However, in the rubber tree field and problem in less than four years, interest had died before the end of that time. The trees matured, the seeds dropped, germinated and produced young trees, but today the tropical jungle surrounds them.

"I counted more than 400 large rubber trees in 20 bushes or more in Camarines and found one tree which measured 25 inches in circumference. I counted 100 small rubber trees under one large tree. These sprouted from the seeds which fell last August and September. I found many of these self-planted trees as thick as a man's wrist and smaller.

"The impression which circulated that Para rubber trees will not grow and flourish in the area where typhoons prevail is a myth, as the sturdy trees which I found completely refute that argument. It is certain that these trees will stand any storm, as they were in the strongest wind like bamboo. It appears that someone expressed the opinion that Para rubber would only thrive outside the typhoon belt and would not grow in the Philippines north of the island of Mindanao. The thousands of more trees planted in an exposed position that actually have withstood many severe typhoons in Albay and Camarines show that this thimble-gum is not founded on fact.

"I am thoroughly convinced that rubber trees will thrive wherever Albay typhoon trees are successfully grown."
