Hints for the Housewife

TRY THIS BUTTERSCOTCH LAYER PIE This pie differs from the ordinary kind, in that it is made up like cake.

Carmelize one quarter of a cup of granulated sugar in an enameled ware saucepan, over a slow fire. Watch carefully and stir so that it does not "catch."

Cut three rounds about a quarter of an inch thick of a flaky pastry to fit the portion of the pie plate and prick well with a fork. Bake in a hot oven until delicately browned.

DELICIOUS CABBAGE ROLLS Vegetables are being used in very appetizing ways nowadays, and cabbage, too, has such possibilities.

Chop one cupful cold meat, one medium sized onion, one green pepper, and add two cupfuls of mashed potatoes. Season with sage and celery salt and shape the mixture into small rolls.

The hand given in the last article as one on which no good players seemed to agree as to the proper bid, is as follows: Hearts—A Clubs—5, 7, 6, 5, 3, 2 Diamonds—A, 5, 7, 2 Spades—A, 7

No score, rubber game. What should Z as dealer bid with the foregoing hand? Four different bids have been suggested as proper with this hand.

Answer to Problem No. 7 Hearts—A, K, Q, 4 Clubs—J, 10, 9, 4, 3, 2 Diamonds—7 Spades—A, 4

No score, rubber game. Clubs are trumps and Z is playing the hand. A opens the king of diamonds and all follow suit.

Hand No. 1 Hearts—J, 10, 8, 3, 2 Clubs—J, 7, 3 Diamonds—9, 5 Spades—K, 6, 5

No score, first game, Z dealt, bid one no-trump and A passed. What should Y now bid with the foregoing hand?

Shoulder of lamb or veal and invite it cut in convenient pieces for serving. Place the meat in an enameled ware stewing kettle, cover it with three cupfuls of boiling water, and add one and a half teaspoonfuls of salt and a teaspoonful of chili powder.

Meanwhile, melt four tablespoonfuls of drippings or other fat in a pan, lay in the cooked meat and brown slowly. Pile the meat in the center of a hot platter and surround with rice.
