LONDON (AP)—The cockroach has come under official ban in London, and his elimination is to be sought in a drive to be undertaken by the College of Pestology, formerly the Vermin Repression Society. A "kill that cockroach" campaign is to be started in London early in March, and will be extended throughout the country. The cockroach swarms with bacteria and vermin which disseminate disease, says the College of Pestology authorities, and it has been suggested that even amputees, scarlet fever and cancer as well can be broadcast in this way.

**Gas Consumption Indicates English Cities' Cooking Hours**  
 LONDON (AP)—The hot Sunday mid-day dinner is still a fetish among the majority of English people, says a report on gas consumption, which in England is at its maximum between 11 o'clock in the morning and 1 p. m. on Sundays.  
 Close observers of gas consumption say that the hours of cooking vary in different towns. Brighton, for instance, spends more time on the seashore and pier and goes on cooking until nearly 2 p. m. Nottingham inclines to the Continental style and uses more gas for cooking in the evening. Scotland, with stricter observance of the Sabbath, does most of its cooking for Sunday on the previous day.

**Meal Checks Instead of Money Reduce Visits of Berlin Beggars**  
 BERLIN (AP)—An effective method of getting rid of professional beggars has been devised by the Berlin Women's club. It has issued books of coupons in denominations of five and ten pennies, which Berlin families can purchase with a view to handing these meal checks to beggars.  
 The beggar takes them to the municipal district welfare office of his district, whereupon he is given a free meal. At the same time his case is looked into by district welfare workers. Professional beggars never come again to a house in which they receive a meal check instead of cash. In fact, the sign furnished to such families for display and reading, "Alms are here given only in the form of meal checks," is usually enough to scare them away.

 must follow. Every severe illness is accompanied by a slow period of convalescence. It is the same with the human body as with the human body. As a matter of fact, it is surprising that business has survived, as well as it has, the great upheaval which it received during the World war.

"The second reason for current dullness in some lines is the direct result of bad weather which certain sections of the country have suffered the past winter. The weather was generally good everywhere until about the middle of January when a tremendously cold wave hit the north with heavy snow storms in many sections. New York state was tied up worse than it has been for years. This snow in the North was accompanied with rains in the South where railroads were washed out and farms were flooded. Then in February the weather suddenly turned warm everywhere. The snow and ice melted; shipping and transportation of all kinds was blocked by logs; and the rivers swelled. It rained for three days with an average temperature of 55 degrees.
