Dante's Trip To Hell Described In Arcade Picture

The name of the great Italian poet Dante Alighieri is known to almost everyone and is associated with his greatest work, which, for want of a better term, is called Divine Comedy, or, in Italian, Divina Commedia. The "Divine Comedy" is composed of three allegorical poems, "Inferno," "Purgatory" and "Paradiso," which describe the poet's journey through the realm of the Hereafter. Although his works, according to Encyclopaedia Britannica, include seventy-eight poems, eight doubtful and fifty-four spurious, the Divine Comedy is by far the best known and by it alone Dante holds place as one of the half-dozen greatest writers of all time.

Upon the poem "Inferno" has been based the motion picture of that name which will be seen at the Arcade theater today, and which has been creating something of a furore throughout the country. The picture is a William Fox production, directed by Henry Otto, who will be remembered as the guiding spirit in "The Temple of Venus."

"Inferno" describes that part of the poet's journey wherein he sees the souls of people who have sinned on earth undergoing eternal punishment in the various circles of Hell. This highly imaginative poem lends itself admirably to picturization and the production is accounted as one of the finest achievements of motion pictures. Synthetic Manufacture May Cheaper Chilean Nitrates LONDON (AP)—The fear of synthetic nitrogen becoming a serious competitor to the Chilean product is now being regarded more seriously than for 20 years past and has caused a rather sharp decline in prices of producing company shares on the stock market.

A writer in the annual review of Alliman, Ltd., nitrate brokers, speaking of the artificial product, declares that synthetic nitrogen in its various forms is daily becoming a more serious competitor to Chilean nitrate of soda, owing to the cheaper price at which it can be sold, and that the erection of several large plants for the production of both sulphate and nitrate of lime is at present under consideration in various countries.

Dealer Describes Demand For Diamonds as Unusually Large LONDON (AP)—There is so much likelihood of diamonds becoming as cheap as colored beads, despite the recent profits discovered in South Africa, Gordon Nathan, a prominent diamond dealer, said recently to a reporter of the Daily Graphic. "There will never be enough natural diamonds to satisfy the demand," the speaker added. "Even if that mysterious syndicate of which we hear so much fulfilled its threat and flooded the market today with \$100,000,000 worth of diamonds no lasting harm would be done. They would be bought up in ten minutes; the trade would suffer a temporary depression and the demand in a short time would be as keen as ever."
